Zoning commission approves bike paths

The preliminary plan for bike paths in College Station was approved last night by the College Station Planning and Zoning Committee.

The proposed bikeways will be laid out along streets surrounding city schools and Texas A&M University. The main concern is to supply bikeways for the estimated 10,000 A&M bicyclists, bike path organizers said.

The Environmental Action Council and the A&M Wheelman Committee proposed the bike path system which will be submitted to the Federal Highway Administration after approval by the College Station City Council.

The administration has a special \$8 million fund for the improvement of bikeways that is awarded on a competitive basis.

D. D. Williamson, supervisory planning engineer for the Bryan district of the Texas Highway Department, said he thought College Station has a good chance of receiving the loan because of the area's heavy bicycle traffic.

The Planning and Zoning Committee also recommended to the city council approval of the final plats for Pecan Tree Estates and White Canyon Estates.

Also, the preliminary plats for Southwood Terrace section 1 and Brentwood section 2 received recommended approval by the committee.

Coffee pot policy remains unaffected by fire

A fire blamed on a forgotten plugged-in coffee pot will not affect the University policy on the use of coffee pots and popcorn poppers.

Dr. Charles Powell, director of Student Affairs, said Monday night that it's unlikely that the Friday fire in Dorm 1 would change the policy.

The fire occurred in the afternoon when the room's resident, sophomore Margaret Machol, left a coffee

pot plugged in when she went to eat lunch and run some errands. She said she was heating the water to room temperature for her roommate's pet fish. The fish was killed in the fire.

Residents on the fourth floor smelled the pot burning at noon, but discounted it as someone cooking. About an hour later, the women across the hall smelled something but remembered that a pair of tennis shoes had been left on the radiator to dry. Finally an aerosol can exploded and a Dunn Hall resident noticed smoke coming from the third floor

window.

He reported the smoke and maintenance men came and sprayed the room with dry chemicals. The chemicals slowed the advance of the fire, said Lt. Bernie Phipps of the College Station Fire Department.

arrived, the fire was pretty much under control, said Phipps. The firemen used very little water except on a set of shelves where the pot was stored.

Machol estimated about \$200 worth of damage was done to personal goods.
