TO BE ELIGIBLE TO PURCHASE THE TEXAS A&M RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN RESIDENCE. CREDIT FOR AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS AND BE IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNIVERSITY. A YEAR IN RESIDENCE MAY CONSIST OF THE FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS OR ONE OF THE ABOVE AND A FULL SEMESTER SESSION (BOTH THE FIRST AND SECOND TERMS). THE HOURS PASSED AT THE PRELIMINARY GRADE REPORT PERIOD IN MARCH 1976 MAY BE USED IN SATISFYING THIS NINETY-TWO (92) HOUR REQUIREMENT. STUDENTS QUALIFYING UNDER THIS REGULATION SHOULD LEAVE THEIR NAMES WITH THE RING CLERK, ROOM SEVEN, RICHARD COKE BUILDING. THIS SHOULD BE DONE PRIOR TO MARCH 10TH IN ORDER FOR ALL RECORDS TO BE CHECKED TO DETERMINE RING ELIGIBILITY. STUDENTS ALREADY HAVING NINETY-TWO (92) COMPLETED HOURS ON RECORD AS OF THE FALL SEMESTER 1975 MAY ORDER AT ANY TIME. THESE REGULAR ORDERS ARE MAILED THE LAST WEEK OF EACH MONTH. GRADUATE STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER WITH PROOF (RECEIPT) THAT THEY HAVE FILED FOR GRADUATION. ORDERS FOR MID-SEMESTER WILL BE TAKEN BY THE RING CLERK STARTING MARCH 22, 1976, AND WILL CONTINUE UNTIL APRIL 23, 1976. ALL RINGS MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHEN THE ORDER IS PLACED. STUDENTS WILL SAVE TIME IF THEY WILL BRING MID-SEMESTER GRADE REPORTS ALONG WHEN READY TO ORDER. STUDENTS WHO HAVE FAILED TO LEAVE THEIR NAMES IN ADVANCE WILL BE ASKED TO RETURN LATER TO ALLOW TIME FOR RECORDS TO BE CHECKED. THE RINGS ARE DUE TO ARRIVE AT THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE ON JUNE 29, 1976. ALL RINGS ORDERED REGARDLESS OF WHETHER ON MARCH 22, 1976 OR APRIL 23, 1976 WILL ARRIVE AT THE SAME TIME. THE RING CLERK IS ON DUTY FROM 8 A.M. TO 12 NOON AND 1 P.M. TO 5 P.M. OF EACH WEEK, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY. HOWEVER, IN ORDERS FOR RECORDS TO BE CHECKED, ORDERS MUST BE PLACED PRIOR TO 11:30 A.M. AND 4 P.M. Tonight's presentation, "The Art of Narration," is sponsored by the Department of English. "The Researched Book: Black Mutiny" will be presented by Owens on March 23 and on March 25 he will present "The Craft of the Novel."

B-CS Orchestra to perform
The Bryan-College Station Chamber Orchestra, directed by Dr. Charles Johnson, will perform Wednesday in the Rudder Theater at 1:30 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Bigfoot lecture set
Bigfoot will be discussed Wednesday night at 8 p.m. in Rudder Tower 601. Dr. Vaughn Bryant Jr., who has been investigating the creature since the late 1960s, will give a presentation, which is sponsored by Cepheid Variable.

Medical degree plans expanded
Baylor College of Medicine and Texas A&M University have expanded their affiliation to include a joint Ph.D. degree program. Texas A&M and Baylor College of Medicine are partners along with Scott and White Memorial Hospital and Clinic and the Veterans Administration in a new medical education program scheduled to enroll its first students later this year. The two schools previously initiated a cooperative program in graduate-level instruction and have jointly conducted research in medically related areas for several years. The diploma of a person successfully completing the joint degree will display the names of both Texas A&M and Baylor.

Centennial prof scheduled
Dr. Lysle H. Peterson, vice president for professional and developmental affairs at the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston, will give three lectures this week as a visiting centennial professor. Peterson's first lecture, trends in simulation of biological systems, is noon Wednesday in room 203, Veterinary Medical Administration Bldg. He will speak later that same day at 4 p.m. on epidemiology of cardiovascular disease. Trends in health care delivery will be discussed Thursday at 11 a.m. by Peterson in room 201 of the Veterinary Medical Science Building.

Vet registration continues
Veterans attending Texas A&M on the GI Bill must appear at the Veterans Administration liaison office on campus before March 17 if they intend to attend summer classes and continue receiving benefits. Registration for the first summer session is May 31. Veterans must certify summer attendance in the first half of March in order for GI Bill payments to begin on time.
