TO BE ELIGIBLE TO PURCHASE THE TEXAS A&M RING, AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST HAVE AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN RESIDENCE, CREDIT FOR AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS AND BE IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNIVERSITY. A YEAR IN RESIDENCE MAY CONSIST OF THE FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS OR ONE OF THE ABOVE AND A FULL SUMMER SESSION (BOTH THE FIRST AND SECOND TERMS). THE HOURS PASSED AT THE PRELIMINARY GRADE REPORT PERIOD IN MARCH 1976 WILL BE USED IN SATISFYING THIS NINETY-TWO HOUR REQUIREMENT. STUDENTS QUALIFYING UNDER THIS REGULATION SHOULD LEAVE THEIR NAMES WITH THE RING CLERK, ROOM SEVEN, RICHARD COKE BUILDING. THIS SHOULD BE DONE PRIOR TO MARCH 10TH IN ORDER FOR ALL RECORDS TO BE CHECKED TO DETERMINE RING ELIGIBILITY. STUDENTS ALREADY HAVING NINETY-TWO (92) COMPLETED HOURS ON RECORD AS OF THE FALL SEMESTER MAY ORDER AT ANY TIME. THESE REGULAR ORDERS ARE MAILED THE LAST WEEK OF EACH MONTH. GRADUATE STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER WITH PROOF (RECEIPT) THAT THEY HAVE FILED FOR GRADUATION. ORDERS FOR MID-SEMESTER WILL BE TAKEN BY THE RING CLERK STARTING MARCH 22, 1976, AND WILL CONTINUE UNTIL APRIL 23, 1976. ALL FEES MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHEN THE ORDER IS PLACED. Editors support U. S. Constitution

PHILADELPHIA — Editors surveyed in preparation for a Bicentennial conference on the Constitution say the Constitution is adequate as it is.

Of the 58 newspaper, magazine and book editors who have responded to the survey by the American Academy of Political and Social Science, 52 say they believe "the Constitution is adequate in its present form to cope with present and future national problems."

The same editors rated "encroachment on personal liberties" as the most important constitutional issue facing the country. Pressed to recommend an amendment, they most frequently mentioned the Equal Rights Amendment.

The survey, which is still in progress, is being conducted by the academy in preparation for the Bicentennial Conference on the United States Constitution, which will be held here next month.

The editors were asked to complete a mailed questionnaire to assist the academy "in assuring that the conference will give proper consideration to all the issues uppermost in the people's minds."

Overwhelmingly, the editors supported the Constitution in its present state. When they were asked what amendments, if any, they would recommend, the leading response was none at all, given by 19.

The Equal Rights Amendment, which would guarantee equality for women, was proposed by 12 of the 58 respondents. Nine expressed some concern over presidential and vice presidential election, raising questions as to improved presidential succession and a better way to pick vice presidents.

No other suggestion for amending the Constitution got more than one or two votes, although a wide variety of topics was mentioned.

Asked to rate in order of importance 10 listed constitutional issues, the editors voted heavily for the personal liberties issue as most important. A distant second was foreign policy.

Others in descending order were separation of church and state, the regulatory powers of government, state's rights, executive privilege, the death penalty, presidential succession and the right to bear arms.

Abortion, a hot issue in the current presidential primaries, finished last in the editor's ratings.

The conference April 5-8 will feature the country's leading constitutional scholars and legal practitioners in discussions of the government's charter document with a view to any needed amendments or changes in practice and interpretation.
