The Young Democrats (YD) have been inactive on the A&M campus for the past two years. Dale Foster, who is a state executive committee member of the Democratic party, said he was asked by some Democratic party members to reorganize YD at A&M.

Gregg Holman, who was elected the club's state committeeman, said that A&M has played an active part in state Democratic activities in the past. He said there was at least one state officer from A&M from 1964-73.

Holman will attend the state Democratic Convention in Austin on April 9-11 as A&M's club representative.

Jim Crawley was elected the 1976 president of YD. Dulcie Brand and Phil Robinson were selected the club's vice-presidents.

The 14 persons which attended the meeting also elected Cathy Hrcncir, treasurer; Kathy Dugat, secretary; and Michael Wiggins as publicity chairman.

Crawley, who is running for Place 3 on the College Station City Council, said the objective of the club will be to get students more active in local, state, and national politics; aid voter registration in campus and city elections and to provide speakers who are politically involved.
