Panel approves bicycle path plan

The University Traffic Panel heard a report from the panel's bicycle subcommittee on a proposed bicycle path plan for the campus to be organized in conjunction with both Bryan and College Station during a special called meeting yesterday.

The bicycle path plan accepted "principle" by the panel for the campus, is to be part of an overall plan for the Bryan-College Station area that will be submitted as a request for a federal grant for bicycle path construction.

This plan, as implemented under panel recommendation would not remove bicycles from malls and sidewalks immediately.

The panel asked a bicycle subcommittee to look into the possibility of raising registration fees to help pay for some of the proposed bicycle paths.

Second group recognized Iranian group splits

Dr. John Koldus, vice-president of student services, has reversed a ruling made by the Student Organization Board last Thursday by officially recognizing a second Iranian Student group.

The group was originally part of the first recognized Iranian Student Organization but, according to Koldus, had political, social and programming differences.

Dr. Carolyn Adair, director of student affairs, heads the Student Organization Board of staff and students which is responsible for recognition of student organizations by the University.

"We felt that there would be some duplication in the two organiza-

tions," said Adair yesterday. This could cause conflicts between the two groups and dilute both programs, she said. She also said that it could cause confusion to new (Iranian) students.

"I did not feel there was any reason to justify not recognizing the group," said Koldus. Apparently, there were some political differences, he said, but there is no reason why there should be only one club from a country. Already there are the Formosa and the Taiwan clubs, which is a similar situation, he said.

Hamazasm Mansoorian is the student leader of the new group.

Tony Neil, president of the International Student Organization, said Mansoorian was an active member of international students, but that he

(Neil) had never met the head of original Iranian Student Organization.

"I don't know why they split," Neil said. He said he thought the different ideas about cultural and political aspects of the group.

Mansoorian could not be reached for comment.
