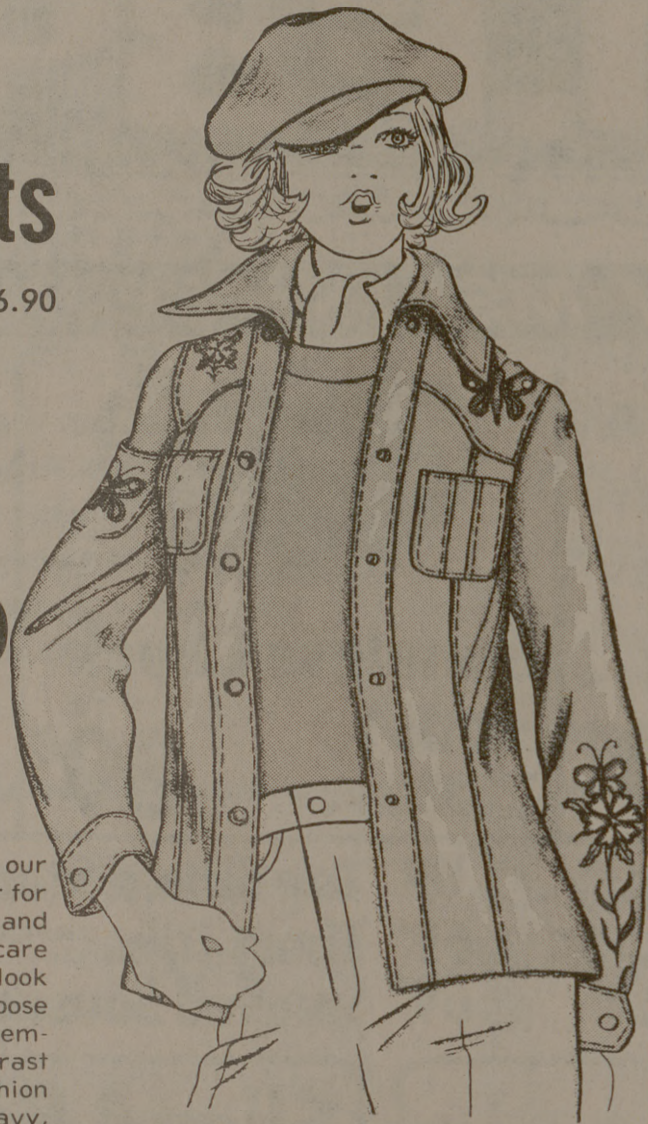

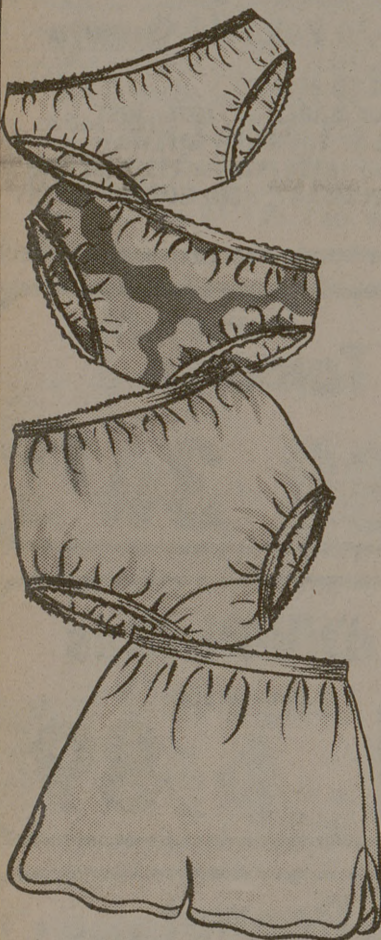

**Leakey to unfold assembly**

A week-long academic assembly highlighted by the appearance of anthropologist Richard Leakey, will unfold Thursday.

The assembly, "Man in a Changing World," is the third of a series addressing the topic, "A World of Man?"

Leakey will be on campus three appearances Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, giving two open question-answer sessions at 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. in Rudder Tower and a 7:30 p.m. Great presentation in Rudder Tower. Tickets to the Great Issues went on sale last Monday.

A supporting program of the assembly offers a variety of film discussions on archaeology, geology, primate behavior and other aspects of man during the week and afternoons March 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, March 30-April 1.

Additional programs will be conducted April 13-15, including a feature length film.

Leakey, visiting professor, made headlines again over a week ago when he and Donald Johanson, as associate FROM (Foundation for Research into the Origins of Man), announced they had discovered fossils of 1.5 million and 3.5 million years old. Leakey's most recent discovery is a complete Homo erectus skull. Questions about the accepted age of the familiar Peking man, thought to be 350,000 years old, the almost identical to the Peking man is a million years older.

Heir to one of the most famous names in human paleontology, Leakey internationally acclaimed scientist, his own right, Leakey is administrative director of Kenya's National Museums.

He is the son of famed British anthropologist Dr. Mary Leakey, the late Dr. Louis Leakey. In his other works, the late Dr. Leakey is credited with discovering a million-year-old Homo habilis. Leakey last year announced the discovery of the oldest reliable remains of man ever found - between 3.35 and 3.75 million years old.

Richard's wife, Meave, also played a major role in the family saga, assembling skull fragments and measuring the skull size and capacity.

In 1972, Leakey announced the discovery of the controversial 1470, dated at 2.8 million years and suggesting man's direct ancestors existed a million years earlier than believed.

His work has appeared in scientific journals including National Geographic.

Following his Monday visit, entitled "Dr. Leakey and the Origins of Man," further examining his contributions, will be shown on the following schedule: March 30 at 11 a.m. in room 209 Bolton Hall and 2 p.m. in room 209 Bolton Hall; March 31 at 11 a.m. and noon in Harrington and 2 p.m. in Harrington.

The assembly offers on Thursday April 1 a 2 p.m. discussion of problems and issues of fossil man in Texas A&M physical anthropology. Dr. O. J. Owen, former associate Leakey's in Kenya. That program will be in 209 Bolton Hall.

**Addresses to highlight math sessions**

The Centennial Assembly of the Texas Section of the Mathematical Association of America will meet in Texas A&M April 2-3.

There will be sessions for contributed papers in mathematical research, pedagogy and expository papers. Two sessions will be held on mathematical pattern recognition and approximation theory. Three invited addresses will be given.

Prof. Paul Erdos of the Hungarian Academy of Science will speak Friday at 11 a.m. in room 701 of Rudder Tower. He is the Centennial Professor of Mathematics at Texas A&M. The subject of the discussion will be "Combinatorial Problems in Elementary Geometry."

Prof. Paul Halmos of Indiana University will speak on "Bounded Linear Operators" Friday at 4:30 p.m. in room 701 of Rudder Tower.

He has been a fellow of the Institute for Advanced Study and is known primarily for his work in functional analysis. Dr. Halmos has made major contributions and written influential texts in logic, linear algebra and measure theory.

Prof. H. L. Alder of the University of California at Davis, president-elect of the MAA, will represent the National Executive Committee at the meeting.

He will address the group Saturday at 10:30 a.m., also in room 701 of Rudder Tower.

In addition to the special addresses, sessions for contributed papers will be held throughout the meeting. Prof. James R. Boone of Texas A&M is the program director.
