BE ELIGIBLE TO PURCHASE THE TEXAS A&M GIFT AN UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT MUST BE AT LEAST ONE YEAR IN RESIDENCE, EDIT FOR AT LEAST NINETY-TWO (92) SEMESTER HOURS AND BE IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE UNIVERSITY. A YEAR IN RESIDENCE MAY CONSIST OF THE FALL AND SPRING SEMESTERS ONE OF THE ABOVE AND A FULL SUMMER SESSION BOTH THE FIRST AND SECOND SEMESTERS. THE HOURS PASSED AT THE PRELIMINARY GRADE REPORT PERIOD IN MARCH 1976 WILL BE USED IN SATISFYING THIS NINETY-TWO HOUR REQUIREMENT. STUDENTS QUALIFYING UNDER THIS REGULATION SHOULD LEAVE EARLY NAMES WITH THE RING CLERK, ROOM 102, RICHARD COKE BUILDING. THIS SHOULD BE DONE PRIOR TO MARCH 10TH. FOR ALL RECORDS TO BE CHECKED TO DETERMINE RING ELIGIBILITY, STUDENTS ALREADY HAVING NINETY-TWO (92) COMPLETED HOURS ON RECORD AS OF THE FALL SEMESTER MAY ORDER AT ANY TIME. THESE REGULATIONS ARE MAILED THE LAST WEEK OF EACH MONTH. GRADUATE STUDENTS ARE ELIGIBLE TO ORDER WITH PROOF (RECEIPT) THAT THEY HAVE FILED FOR GRADUATION. ORDERS FOR MID-SEMESTER WILL BE TAKEN THE RING CLERK STARTING MARCH 22, 1976, AND WILL CONTINUE UNTIL APRIL 23, 1976. ALL ORDERS MUST BE PAID FOR IN FULL WHEN THE ORDER IS PLACED. Commission plans 'consumer view'

In response to the Advertising Council of America's campaign to show the "corporate view" of the economy, the national Peoples Bicentennial Commission said it plans to give the "consumer view" of the subject.

The council's 3-to-5 year campaign will use public service announcements and education materials as a means of illustrating the business image of the American economy. The commission, using the same avenues as the council, said it will present the consumer, employee and community view of the economy.

The council calls its plan a counter campaign to offer the American public an alternative view to the "commission's high power selling of the business community's view."

The council said it will address a broad range of issues including, the concentration of power and monopolistic practices in key sectors of the economy, multinational corporations and the flight of jobs, and price fixing and inflationary practices of giant corporations.

The council was formed as a private answer to the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration. The federally recognized organization.
