

Prof dies in collision

Memorial services will be held for an A&M professor at 3 p.m. Thursday in the All-Faiths chapel.

Dr. Keith A. Sutherland, assistant professor of history, was killed on March 19 in Pecos when a tractor-trailer rig swerved and collided head on with his car.

He is being buried today in his home town: Ellsworth, Maine.

Sutherland received his B.A. and M.A. degrees in education from the University of Maine and his Ph. D. from Cornell University.

This was Sutherland's second year at A&M. Previously he had taught at Tarleton State University and several other universities.

He was an authority on pre-Civil War congressional politics.

Former student to start lecture series

Herman Gollob, vice president and member of the board of directors of Atheneum Press of New York and 1951 Texas A&M graduate, is beginning a series of public addresses, classroom lectures, talks with university officials and student visits as an A&M centennial professor.

His first address, "Texas Writers I Have Known and Loved," is at 8 p.m. Tuesday in room 226, Evans Library. On April 2 in the same room, Gollob will make a 4 p.m. address on the book-publishing process entitled "Hit or Myth."

He remains on campus through April 3.

Aside from academic appearances, Gollob will also have dinner with the Aggie Players, in which he was active during his undergraduate days, and members of Aggie Cinema, the descendant organization of the A&M Film Society, of which he was president.

He joined Atheneum as editor-in-chief of trade books in October, 1971, and was made a vice-president the same year. He was made a director in late 1975. Previously, he had been director of Harper's Magazine Press which he founded in 1969.

Centennial prof to lecture

Dr. Robert Fogel, visiting centennial professor from Harvard University and the University of Cambridge, England, will present a series of lectures on quantitative historical analysis.

Fogel will speak every night through Friday at 7:30 p.m. in room 100, Harrington Education Center.

Beginning today, his topics are: "Explanation for the Relative Efficiency of Slave Agriculture in the Antebellum South," "Economic and Political Influence on Distribution of Skills Within the Slave Labor Force," "Further Evidence on the Nutritional Adequacy of the Slave Diet" and "Internal and External Factors in Development of Black Culture under Slavery."

Biologist, architect to speak

A biologist and an architect will speak at Texas A&M University this week as visiting centennial professors.

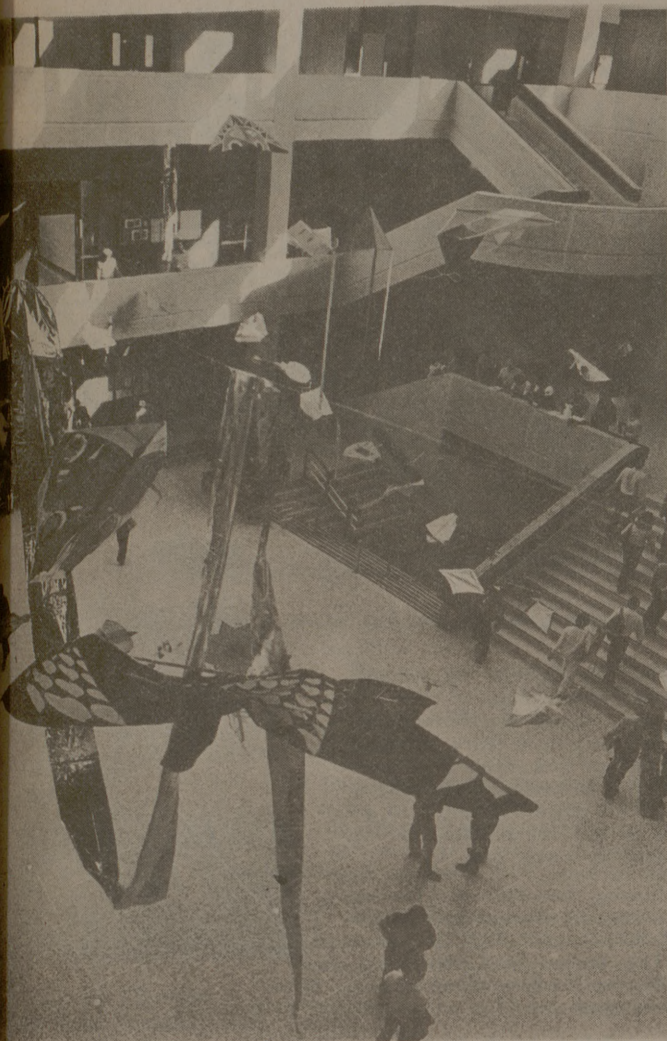
Dr. Thomas Eisner, professor of biology at Cornell University, will give a series of public lectures under the general heading of "To Be An Insect." He is an outstanding authority on the behavior, ecology and physiology of insects.

Prof. Eisner will speak today on the topic, "To Depend on Plants" and on "To See the Invisible" tomorrow.

These will be presented at 8 p.m. in MSC 206.

Dr. James M. Fitch, professor of architecture and historic preservation at Columbia University, will give a public lecture today at 4 p.m. in the Architecture Building auditorium on "Architecture Worth Saving."

Fitch is a pioneer in environmental design and a leading architectural historian. One of the first preservation programs in the U. S. was started by him at Columbia.

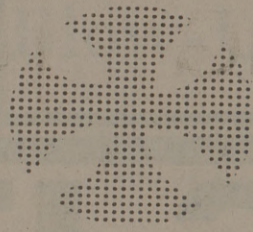

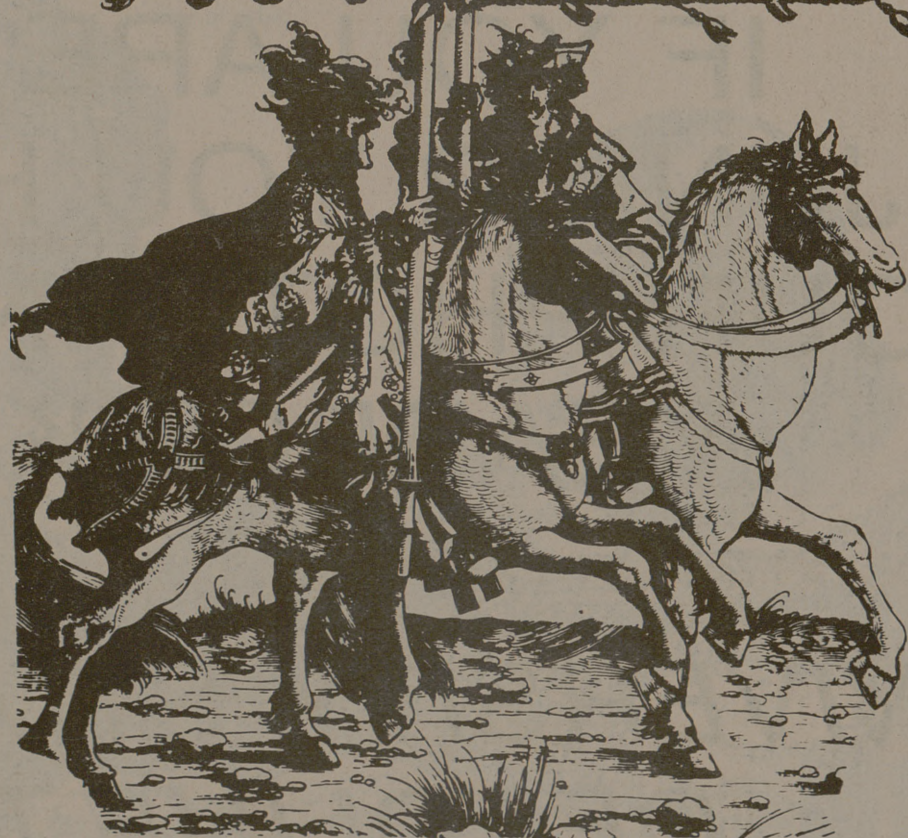
