36 nations to foster understanding

Next week may be a good time to expand your horizons. Students from all the 36 nations participating in the International Week from Sunday through Friday will hold a banquet at Texas A&M. There will be banquets, speakers, a talent show and events marking the occasion. The purpose of the International Week is to foster a greater understanding between students from all over the world," said Tony Neil, the director of the International Student Association.

The Organization of Arab Students will begin the week with a banquet and a speaker Sunday evening. Dr. Abdel Wahab Messirri will speak on "Zionism as a Form of Racism." Dr. Messirri is from the Arab League Office in New York. A belly dancer will perform and Arab students from other colleges in Texas will play traditional Arab music after the banquet. The belly dancer is quite talented and is able to flip coins with her belly, Neil said. The banquet, featuring five types

of Arab food, will begin at 7 p.m. in Room 224 of the Memorial Student Center. Tickets are three dollars and are available at the Rudder Box Office.

"To Die in Madrid," a documentary film on the Spanish Civil War, will be shown in Room 601 of the Rudder Tower on Monday at 7:30 p.m. The black and white film has long been banned in Spain because it unfavorably depicts Franco's rebels. Admission will be fifty cents. "The U.S.S.R.'s Interpretation of

Detente and the Upsurge of Communist Ideology in Western Europe" will be the subject of a talk Tuesday by Mr. Serebrjakov (serb-jok-ov), the Second Secretary of the U.S.S.R. Mission to the United Nations. Several weeks ago, Soviet Party Boss Leonid Brezhnev said that detente is a means of achieving Communist objectives.

The talk will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the Rudder Tower Auditorium. Admission will be free. An "International Delicacies Banquet" will be held that evening at 6:30, followed by a Talent Show at 8:00. They will be held on the second floor of the MSC and there will be no admission charge for either. A soccer game between the Or-

ganization of Arab Students and the African Students Association will begin at 5:00 p.m. Thursday on the soccer field.

"The World Speaks on Hunger" will be the subject of a panel discussion Thursday evening at 7:30. Students from different nations, including one from the United States, will participate in the round-table discussion in Room 601 of the Rudder Tower.

The International Week will end Friday with a film on the People's Republic of China. "One-Fourth of Humanity" is a documentary by Edgar Snow, an American journalist. It will be shown at 8:00 p.m. in the Rudder Theater. Admission will be \$1.00.

Honeybees — seeing the invisible

Honeybees see color, says Dr. Paul Eisner, professor of Biology at Texas A&M University. Eisner, a visiting lecturer in the Department of Biology, presented studies in color vision of the honeybee Wednesday night in the Memorial Student Center at A&M.

Invisible" Eisner said that studies show honeybees see colors in the light spectrum ranging from yellow to ultraviolet. Honeybees cannot distinguish the longer wave lengths of red and orange.

Eisner said that flowers produce ultraviolet patterns which serve as "nectar guides." These guides direct

the bees to the nectar which they use as food. The guides also enable bees to function in flower pollination.

Eisner addressed approximately 60 people in the chemical and mechanical defenses of insects and the use of plant chemicals by insects were the subjects of his Monday and Tuesday night speeches.
