What are your qualifications for the office?
I've been a student senator, a member of the Student Government

Finance Committee, a member of the Student Service Fee Allocation Committee and I'm a finance major.
How do you define your office?
How would you expand your office and why?
The office of vice president of finance is fairly large. He is the chairman of the Student Business Council, which I would activate. The vice president for finance is also chairman of the Student Service Fee Allocation Committee, and chairman of the Student Senate Finance Committee which is in the senate itself. That committee is the one that handles the student government funds. So he's the one who has the final say and signs the checks.
Expansion would be like a student, faculty and staff credit union to be placed on campus, and several committees to totally re-evaluate all

the student service fees. This credit union is to give students a chance to gain credit for themselves in the community while they're here at A&M.
A committee was established to study the business affairs of the University. What do you see as the purpose of this committee? How would you ensure its effectiveness in the future?
If through this council we could give the students the knowledge of what they're paying for and let them in on what they're spending while they're here, I think that would be a service to them. Maybe an educational series on the University itself and the funds sponsored by the Student Business Council, backed by the student government and run in The Battalion would be a good idea.

What are your qualifications for the office?

Comes with Town Hall experience

In such things as intramurals, I would be in favor of student service fees... where there's widespread participation.

I'd like to see them under the MSC Directorate and Council. I can get what's going on. I think I can be responsive to students as well as business interests.
How should the money be used? Why?
It's the students' money going into it. So after all including new machines, etc., I should go to the students to see to some project that could be of benefit to the students.

What are your qualifications for the office?
