would have also received Southwest Conference championship rings, but the rings have not been delivered. The staff and close affiliates of the Southwest Conference champs also were presented with team pictures.


The voice of Aggie basketball, Mike Mistovich, attended the affair and did not approach the microphone except to receive the picture which Metcalf presented to the
