Memories revisited

Pioneer days difficult

A jail up in a tree for difficult prisoners was one of the memories of John M. Lawrence Sr.

Lawrence, who was born in 1899, was one of the persons interviewed by students in a course offered at Texas A&M University — Cultural Geography. The purpose of the interviews was to get more information about the settlement of Brazos County. Those who were interviewed had been long time residents of this region.

Lawrence said that those prisoners who were more difficult than the others were put up in a tree and left there for three or four days - in any kind of weather. He said that the prisoners were ready to come down at the end of that time. He didn't give an exact date that the jail was in existence or say just how the prisoners were kept up in the tree.

The course is taught by Dr. Clarissa Kimber and she said that the main interest of the project was to find out how people coped with living and the environment in the early 1900's.

Lawrence also gave some advice for people in his interview. He said, "First - To keep the very best company possible.

"Second - Choose a worthy objective ... a challenge.

"Third - Work at it hard...then live for the best things in life."

Some of the questions that were asked by the students included recollections of floods and disasters. While some placed a flood as the primary disaster others might not remember it at all.

While there was some disunity about things that were remembered in the lives of the people, there was one element that lay underneath all

of the interviews - the deep satisfaction with Brazos County and a willingness to leave. Samuel Matoya, another interviewee, said he had his shoes tied so tight he

leave. All the interviews that were done last year are now in the University Archives.

First Lady prefers another nickname

First Lady Betty Ford says she is enjoying her citizen's band radio but would have preferred a nickname like "Steady Betty" instead of the "First Mama" handle that she says "was sort of wished upon me."

Mrs. Ford, in a campaign appearance for her husband in Sacramento yesterday, was greeted by California's only female statewide office holder, Secretary of State March Fong Eu, and accepted a wooden keg of California brandy from her.

Unveiling of statue part of festivities

This week is the annual Harry S. Truman week in Independence, Mo.

Margaret Truman Daniel will unveil on Saturday the nation's first full-figure statue of her father. President Ford is scheduled to deliver an address dedicating the statue.

The nine-foot bronze figure of Truman is mounted on a pedestal on the east lawn of the Jackson County Courthouse, a few steps from the office Truman used when he was the court's presiding judge. The statue, by Gilbert Franklin of Providence, R.I., depicts Truman taking one of his famous morning walks.

Actress' son held on murder charge

The adopted son of actress Jane Russell and former football star Bob Waterfield has been held for investigation of murder.

Robert "Bucky" Waterfield, 20, was released yesterday on \$5,000 bond on an attempted murder charge. Hours later, after the death of the man shot, Oscar Hernandez, Waterfield was arrested again on a murder charge.

Comedienne leaves intensive-care unit

Totie Fields, who had her leg amputated, is resting comfortably at a New York hospital and is expected to return home within 10 days, comedienne's manager says.

Howard Henderstein says Wednesday that Miss Fields has been moved from the intensive-care unit at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital.

Miss Fields, 46, had surgery for phlebitis in her left leg on April 15 but the operation was unsuccessful and the leg was amputated below the knee two days later, Henderstein said.

The night-club entertainer is expected to return to the stage sometime this summer, Henderstein said. Miss Fields will probably have her show business return in Las Vegas, where she has a home.

Cardinal released after fast recovery

John Cardinal Cody, head of the Catholic archdiocese of Chicago, was released from a hospital after surgery for gall bladder surgery.

Doctors said Wednesday that the cardinal had progressed "very satisfactorily" since his operation April 21 but that he has been advised to limit activities for some time.
