considered essential since the visit by Simon will be widely interpreted as showing U.S. support for the Pinochet govern-

They said the U.S. interest in the Simon trip is to put an "imprimateur of approval" on the government's economic policies, which should help the Chileans to attract foreign money they need for investments and to help pay off their estimated foreign debt of \$4.5 billion.


