

Ags survey lakes

The National Park Service has awarded Texas A&M archeologists \$25,000 to survey and assess beds of two future reservoirs in Williamson County near Georgetown and Liberty Hill.

Field teams are locating and recording sites of prehistoric human habitation while simultaneously carrying on an environmental impact study.

Principal investigators for the project are Dr. Vaughn Bryant Jr. and Dr. Harry Shafer. Texas A&M research archeologist Ed Baxter is supervising field work.

The sites, North Fork Lake and Granger (formerly Laneport) Lake, are on the San Gabriel River.

Shafer said he initiated some work in the area in 1963 while at the University of Texas. Some subsequent work was done by UT archeologists, but only now has the extensive assessment begun, he explained.

Time is now an important factor. "We have about five years work to do in two years," said Shafer.

Another problem to crop up for A&M workers is illegal arrowhead hunting on the federal lands by amateur collectors. Such weekend recoveries are against both federal and state laws, said the researchers, and they destroy any hopes of scientific study at such sites.

Granger Lake, which has a conservation capacity of 65,500 acre-feet, will extend approximately 15 river miles upstream from its 111-foot tall dam, inundating about eight miles of Willis Creek near Granger, east of Georgetown.
