

Party facility available for A&M

A place for residence hall or organization parties has been spruced up and has proven popular with Texas A&M University students. Opened in late April, the facility was booked almost every evening the remainder of the spring semester. It is located west of the main campus, near the Turkey Creek Rd. and Highway 60 intersection. A Quonset hut previously used for storage, the building provides

space for up to 200 students, with a band stage, sound system and small kitchen. President Jack K. Williams helped Student Affairs and the Residence Hall Association (RHA) acquire and fix up the quarters. Dr. Charles Powell and Ron Blatchley of Student Affairs guided the effort. Dr. Williams provided funds, but RHA pitched in labor and talents to clean up and fix up. The 1975-76 RHA president, George Lippe, did

the carpentry work. Another environmental design major and RHA vice president, Kim Schaeffer, drew plans. Gregg Hennington, Moses Hall president, designed the sound system, started it operating and worked out a rental plan. Open to student halls and groups that have been hard-pressed to find a place large enough for get-togethers, the facility rents on a daily basis for a \$50 deposit and \$50

use fee. The latter goes for maintenance, new equipment and furnishings. Reservations are made through Larry Ludewig, at 845-6971 or at Lounge A-2. Once used as a motor park and military vehicle maintenance facility, the layout includes two huts. In the 1950's, nearby terrain served as a tank driving course for cadets. Students involved hope eventually to acquire and fix up the second building. First however, they plan to clear a park, erect picnic tables and recreational equipment, such as volleyball nets. Gravelled parking areas have been enlarged to handle traffic. "It's a good party spot," remarked Dr. Carolyn Adair, Student Affairs activities director.

Conference set for Oct.

The Second International Marine Technology Assessment Conference will be held three days at Texas A&M University, Oct. 5-8, according to spokesman Dr. Dan Bragg. The program is sponsored by the Sea Grant Center for Marine Resources, the International Society for Technology Assessment and the European Oceanic Association. The conference will provide for an

exchange of information, ideas, and methods on a progression of related session themes. These include: goals and challenges to harvest major sources of energy and food from the oceans while protecting the environment; a description of the analytical and forecasting tools of technology assessment methodology; the action programs and needs for coordinated effort by the private and public sectors to achieve these goals.

Placement center advises students
Sixty-nine organizations recruited on the Texas A&M campus for the first time during the past academic year, according to the Career Planning and Placement Center's annual report. In addition, says placement director Louis J. Van Pelt, organizations absent in the past rescheduled stops. As a result, 854 recruiters representing 356 organizations visited the campus in the fall and spring. Two hundred twenty-six employers recruited in the fall and 275 in the spring. Over 12,500 student interviews were conducted and 1,257 Aggies registered for interviews during the period, the report says. Van Pelt says that individual student visits for advice increased. Another of the year's highlights was establishment of the Wendell Horsley Career Planning and Placement Library Collection. The collection has corporate brochures, annual reports, career information on government and education, general handouts, pamphlets, directories and periodicals. The center is located in Rudder Conference Tower.
