New animal, food science center to be named in honor of Kleberg

Texas A&M University's new animal and food sciences center will be named in honor of the late Robert Justus Kleberg, Jr., longtime leader in world agriculture, business and philanthropy and president and general manager of King Ranch for more than 35 years.

Clyde H. Wells, chairman of the TAMU System's Board of Regents, said board members approved the naming of the building now under construction at A&M's West Campus, and set August 16 for the naming ceremony, in conjunction with the American Society of Animal Science Conference at A&M.

The multimillion dollar animal and food science center is a five-story structure that will accommodate the Animal Science Department, largest in the College of Agriculture, as well as the Poultry Science Department, plus food services related to meat and dairy products, Wells added.

Kleberg, who became part of the management of King Ranch about 1919, then served as president and general manager of the ranch from the time it became a family-owned corporation in 1935 until his death in 1974.

"He directed King Ranch operations into a worldwide corporation, and provided both tangible support and encouragement throughout the years to Texas A&M. King Ranch provided animals, land resources, and funds for research in animal nutrition, grasses, meats, biochemistry, and animal genetics. As chairman of the Caesar Kleberg Wildlife Foundation, Mr. Kleberg was principally responsible for a significant grant to the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station for worldwide wildlife research.

"Research funds and other major contributions have come to the

Texas A&M University System result of Mr. Kleberg's interest in A&M programs," Wells said.

Dr. H. O. Kunkel, A&M's director of agriculture, said the new animal food sciences center reflects activities that were closest to Kleberg's interests.

"The center, containing more than 165,000 square feet of space, includes a large and modern auditorium that can seat 350 people, more than a dozen classrooms, seminar rooms, modern laboratories for animal nutrition research, and immunology studies, science investigations and pathology research, and offices for the dean added.

Naming of the building scheduled August 16 at the conclusion of the 1976 ASAS Conference, expected to attract some 1,900 scientists and educators to Texas A&M, is the national professional meeting.
