AGGIELAND REFUND POLICY Yearbook fees are refundable in full during the semester in which payment is made. Thereafter no refunds will be made on cancelled orders. Yearbooks must be picked up during the academic year in which they are published.

Students who will not be on campus when yearbooks are published, usually by September 1, must pay a mailing and handling fee. Yearbooks will not be held, nor will they be mailed without the necessary fees having been paid.

OFFICIAL NOTICE TO TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

In the past, certain information has been made public by Texas A&M University as a service to students, families and other interested individuals.

In the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974," the following directions information may be made public unless the student desires to withhold all or any portion of it:

Student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student.

Any student wishing to withhold any or all of this information should fill out the appropriate form, available to graduate students at the Graduate College and to undergraduate students at the Registrar's Office, no later than 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, September 14, 1976.
