## Traffic Panel invites questions, suggestions

Any students or faculty members with questions, suggestions or complaints concerning campus traffic can bring them before Texas A&M's Traffic Panel.

The panel, made up of both students and faculty members, is appointed by the president of A&M and reports to the vice-president for Student Services, presently Dr. John Koldus.

The purpose of the Traffic Panel is to make recommendations to the university regarding vehicle and bicycle regulations and restrictions, parking facilities and pedestrian safety.

"The panel is advisory, relating to policy. We do not make decisions; we make recommendations," said Dr. Virgil Stover, who was chairman of the panel for the past three years.

"We do not go into its-bitsy detail," he continued. "The panel serves as a source of information for what will eventually result in administrative decision."

Stover pointed out that the main area of problems concerns motor vehicle regulations. A subcommittee is appointed every year to make any revisions in the regulations that seem to be necessary, such as changes in wording, allocation of parking space or the amount of the fees.

A draft of these revisions is taken to the Traffic Panel, which (providing the revisions are approved) recommends them to the administration.

The panel meets on the first and third Wednesday of every month from 3:15 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. in Rudder Tower. The meetings are open to all who wish to attend.

Those with suggestions or complaints may call Stover at 845-1046 or Dr. D.L. Woods, chairman of the panel, at 845-1717.

Also, any questions regarding traffic that students or faculty members want answered can be put on the agenda of the panel's meetings by calling Kathy Bush at 845-1717.

The first meeting of the panel is tomorrow, in Rudder Tower 404. Few recommendations or decisions will be made at this meeting, Stover said. "It's primarily to review where we are," he added.

## Creativity displayed in craft shop

Make a solid silver band for just \$2. Sound impossible? Not at all. The MSC Craft Shop offers courses in jewelry casting where a student can make a ring for the cost of the shop used.

The Arts and Crafts classes in the Craft Shop are nonacademic. This means no tests, no assignments due at certain times and no homework. The shop is there to allow students to enjoy themselves, and it gives them a chance to learn something artistic and creative.

Classes run from two to six weeks in duration. They meet one night a week in the Craft Shop in the lower level of the MSC.

Some of the shorter classes include basket making, bread dough art and designing geodesic domes (with the use of triangles). Students can also take classes in sand terrariums, string art, cake decorating, antique refinishing, advanced framing, watercolor painting, drawing, sandal making and needlepoint.

Mary O'Neill, a professional illustrator for the Texas A&M Physical Plant, will be teaching a class in commercial illustrating. This class teaches students the basics of drawing and layouts for use in magazines and newspapers. O'Neill will also instruct on print reproduction.

The finished products made in the Craft Shop are often offered for sale. The shop is open from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday and from 1 to 7 p.m., Saturday and Sunday.

Karen Zantow, Program Director for the Craft Shop, says she hopes students will come in and look around. "We have many things here to see and students might see something they would like to do," she said.

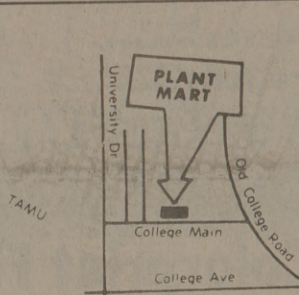
