Public utility panel to work on Bell phone rate hike

AUSTIN, Tex. — The Texas Public Utility Commission starts public work sessions today on Southwestern Bell Telephone Co.'s request for rate increases amounting to \$298 million. It is expected to grant routinely the motion of its general counsel, John Bell, to suspend the increases that the Bell system could put into effect on Oct. 7 if the three-man commission failed to act. Today's pre-hearing conference also involves the question of whom the commission will allow to intervene as full-fledged parties in the case with full rights to present testimony and evidence. Among those asking full status as parties are Atty. Gen. John Hill, the Texas Consumer Association, Common Cause and Chairman Lane Denton of the House Social Services Committee. Bell's proposed increases include doubling of the present 10-cent price of a pay telephone call, higher rates for intrastate long distance calls that last longer than a minute.

**TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY**  
OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS  
Eligible to purchase the Texas A&M ring, undergraduate student must have at least 92 semester hours and be in good standing with the university. A year in residence must consist of the fall and spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session both the first and second terms. The year passed at the Preliminary Grade Report on October 20, 1976 may be used in lieu of the ninety-two hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation must leave their names with the ring clerk, Mrs. Seven, Richard Coke Building. This must be done prior to October 20th in order for records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. This does not apply to students already having ninety-two (92) completed hours or more rings at any time. These orders must be placed during the last week of each month. Students are eligible to order with (prepaid) that they have filed for graduation.  
Orders for mid-semester will be taken by the ring clerk starting October 21st, 1976, and will continue until December 1st, 1976. Students placing their orders during this mid-semester period may order after final grades are posted and the ninety-two (92) hours are completed.  
Orders must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Students will save time if they will bring grade reports along when ready to order. Anyone who has failed to leave their name will be asked to return later to allow their records to be checked.  
Orders ordered at mid-semester regardless of when on October 21st, 1976 or December 1st, 1976, will be mailed in at the same time. Orders will be due to arrive here at the Registrar's office on January 31, 1976.  
Ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon Monday to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 4:30 a.m. and 4 p.m.
