Bargainers for both sides yesterday agreed they were making progress, the first time they've expressed such confidence since the walkout by 170,000 hourly employees started Sept. 15.

But there was no word that round-the-clock talks would begin, the traditional sign that a settlement is near.

Sources at Ford headquarters, where the bargainers met yesterday, said the two sides began narrowing their differences late Wednesday on the union's demand for increased job security and restrictions on layoffs.
