

**A&M paleobotanist elected 'Geoscience and man' editor**

Dr. Vaughn Bryant Jr., Texas A&M University paleobotanist, has been elected editor for the American Association of Stratigraphic Palynologists Inc. Bryant is a specialist in a branch of botany dealing with fossil plants.

His duties include editing proceedings of meetings, studies, and papers of the association for publication in "Geosciences and Man," AASP's annual journal published by the Louisiana State University School of Geosciences.

Articles on anthropology, archeology, geography, geology, meteorology, paleontology and other geosciences are printed in the publication.

**Nutrition, health for man, animals will be main topic**

Some interesting aspects of human nutrition will be discussed during the 1976 Texas Nutrition Conference at Texas A&M University today and tomorrow.

The human nutrition portion of an eight-hour program in the Convention Center 301 on the campus, Friday starting at 9 a.m.

It will feature a panel discussion on "The Nutritional Implications of Utilizing Novel Food Sources." Other presentations include: Dr. H. F. De Luca, "Nutrition and Functions of Vitamins"; Dr. John McKigney, "Are we in a High Risk Group?"; Dr. Y. Yelley, "Innovative Aspects of Nutritional Anthropology"; and Raymond Reiser, "Retrospective Prospect in Human Nutrition."

The bulk of the two-day conference, however, will be on the subject of "Poultry and Livestock Nutrition," taking place in the Ramada Inn beginning at 9 a.m. daily.

Some of the subjects to be discussed by international experts at the animal section include: Avian Contamination; Force Molt; Laying Hens; Egg Shell Quality; Fatty Liver Syndrome; Bacteremia in Animal Feeds; Control of Cholera in Turkeys; Energy in Feedlot Beef Production; Bacterial Disease and Inclusion in Hepatitis in Commercial Chickens; Supplemental Feeding of Beef Cattle and others.

**AGGRIEVED REFUND POLICY**

"Yearbook fees are refundable in full during the semester in which payment is made. Thereafter no refunds will be made on cancelled orders. Yearbooks must be picked up during the academic year in which they are published.

"Students who will not be on campus when the yearbooks are published, usually by September 1, must pay a mailing and handling fee. Yearbooks will not be held, nor will they be mailed without the necessary fees having been paid.

"Refunds will not be made on books not picked up within one semester of the publication date (December 17, 1976 for the 1976 Aggieband)."

"This policy takes effect with the delivery of the 1976 edition of the Aggieband."

**TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS**

To be eligible to purchase the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year in residence, credit for at least one year in residence, and be in good standing with the university. A year in residence may consist of the fall and spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session (both the first and second terms). The hours posted at the Preliminary Grade Report Period on October 20, 1976 may be used in satisfying this ninety-two hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building. This should be done prior to October 20th in order for all records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. This does not apply to students already having ninety-two (92) completed hours on record prior to the fall semester because they may order rings at any time. These orders are mailed during the last week of each month. Graduate students are eligible to order with proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation.

Orders for mid-semester will be taken by the ring clerk starting October 21st, 1976, and will continue until December 1st, 1976. Students not placing their orders during this mid-semester period may order after final grades are posted and the ninety-two (92) hours are completed.

All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Students will save time if they will bring grade reports along when ready to order. Anyone who has failed to leave their name in advance will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked.

All rings ordered at mid-semester regardless of whether on October 21st, 1976 or December 1st, 1976, will be mailed in at the same time and will be due to arrive here at the Registrar's Office on January 21, 1976.

The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m.

We hope this information will be helpful and extend our congratulations.
