**Wrestling team set for match**

The Texas A&M Wrestling Team begins its regular season in Ft. Worth against TCU on Nov. 5. Practice showed a record turnout of over 40 new wrestlers, along with 16 veterans and seven returning 1976 lettermen. Prior to this time, the team had been working out in an off-season program consisting of running, drills, and weight training which began September 6, 1976.

The Aggies, who were State Runner-up Champions last year, will find the usually strong Texas Tech team out of Lubbock to be their main obstacle in winning the Southwest Conference Crown this year. Other strong contenders in the Texas Conference this season will include Richard College, South West Texas State, and North Texas State.

The A&M Squad is extremely well rounded this year with at least three wrestlers in each weight class and in some classes as many as four competing for the varsity spot. The team is full of young talent from all over the country and will be depending on the services of new wrestlers like Rick Vigue, a 118 lbs. Texas state runner-up from San Antonio, Bob

Benebento, a 134 pounder from Murrysville, Pennsylvania, and Jack Cliff, a free style wrestler from Ohio at 142 lbs.

The Ags' designated captains for the 1976-77 season are Bob Hines, 126 lbs. from Bryan, and Blair Monhollon, 167 lbs. from Tulsa, Oklahoma. Both were outstanding wrestlers last year and will hold key positions on the varsity squad this year. Monhollon was A&M's only State Champion last year and was honored by being voted Most Valuable Wrestler by the Texas Wrestling Coaches Association. Hines took runner-up in his weight class in the 1976 State Tournament and received trophies for both fastest pin and most team points.

Other wrestlers that will probably round out the varsity squad this season will be Tim Caulton at 150 lbs., Jay Clements at 155 lbs., Dave Schlosberg at 177 lbs., Mike Larson at 190 lbs., and Richard Lynn at the heavy weight slot. Coaching the Aggies this season for his second year is Jim Giunta from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Last year under the

leadership of Coach Giunta the Ags took second place in a tough battle for the Southwest Conference Title and ended the season with a record of 11 wins and 4 losses. Giunta attended Penn State University for three years where he captured the Commonwealth Campus Wrestling Title in 1973. Then in the fall of 1973, he transferred to Texas A&M and while wrestling for the Aggies in 1974, took first in the State Cham-

ampionship at his weight class. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education from Texas A&M and is presently working on a graduate program in Exercise Physiology. When asked for comment on the team, Coach Giunta said, "The Ags have a lot of potential this year and with good teamwork, I feel they are capable of doing both the Southwest Conference and Texas State titles.

**Lunkers 'N Lies**

For the first time in several weeks, things look promising right now for a good weekend of bass fishing. And it just so happens that Lake Conroe will be the site of a bass tournament this weekend, the seventh of the year for the Aggie Bass Club.

This contest will be a team tournament, with two freshmen per team. Teams may fish either Saturday or Sunday, and a total of 20 fish may be weighed in by each pair of anglers. Although the fish are weighed together, each contestant must keep his fish separate so that individual point totals can be tabulated.

Shiloh Marina has been designated as tournament headquarters, and is a good choice because it is located about halfway between the dam and the upper end of the lake. Fishermen will be able to reach either end of the lake within a reasonable length of time. Fishing hours will last from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

As mentioned earlier, things are shaping up for a successful weekend for fishermen, and not only on Lake Conroe. Fishing seems to have picked up in the last few days on many lakes after several weeks of cold fronts and rain.

The biggest factor is the weather. Bass have a strange habit of getting "lockjaw" after a cold front passes. They just won't hit. Right before a front the fishing can be great, and just after it passes you'd swear there's not a fish in the whole lake. It seems that every time I've hit a lake lately it's been on the tail of a front.

There's a reason for having the November tournament on Lake Conroe this year. Tom Bennett, tournament director, said the tournament was held there last November and the fishing was excellent. Only eight participants turned out, but those eight brought in almost 60 lbs. of fish. That's an average

of about 7 1/2 lbs. per fish, which ain't bad. This year could be as good as the weather holds.

I talked to a guy at Shiloh on Tuesday night, and he said fishing really picked up with the change in weather of the last few days. A large fish have been brought in, including a 5 1/4 pounder. Most of the larger fish have come from the area, but fishing has been consistent along the moss beds and creek areas.

Several limits have been set from water four to 12 feet deep in the submerged creekbeds of Lake Creek and Little Lake Creek.

Best baits have been crabs and worms, and some topwater baits have been producing early and each day. Fish will probably be found a little shallower right now with the mild weather at hand, that can only make fishing easier for everyone.

Entry fee for this Aggie Bass tournament will be the usual \$1.00. Any A&M student or staff member may enter by showing up at tournament headquarters Saturday morning. Club dues must also be paid before entering.
