Janitors finish sixth in the nation

After every Texas A&M home football game a group of students labors faithfully at removing the rubbish from the Kyle Field bleachers.

These volunteer janitors comprise the sixth ranked nationally A&M water polo team. Recently recognized by the University for National Collegiate Athletic Association competition, the A&M water polo team placed sixth in the national tourney held in Long Beach, Calif. While concluding their season with a 19-4 record, the Aggies won only one of three tournament games, which was still good enough for sixth place.

Finishing ahead of A&M were Stanford, UCLA, the University of California at Irvine, Santa Barbara and Arizona. Loyola of Chicago and Pittsburgh finished behind the Aggies.

Coach Dennis Fosdick's team had a chance to place higher, but fell to Arizona 12-9 in a hotly contested match. The Ags lost to UCLA 18-3 and defeated Pittsburgh 21-13.

"I think we did very well for our first year in the NCAA," Fosdick said. "Everyone seemed to be impressed with us."

He pointed out that while most of the teams at the meet were primarily composed of water polo players (that is, players recruited because of their water polo ability), A&M is a team made up primarily of swimmers. This aids the Aggies to some degree in such areas as speed and maneuvering in the water.

The Aggies' semi-soft schedule at the end of their regular season was a partial reason for the team not doing better, said Fosdick.

"We need to schedule some tougher teams later in the year," Fosdick said. He added that the Aggies usually peak (are at their best) around October. "We haven't played anybody strong since then" he said.

Texas A&M takes an annual trip to the West Coast to go against some of the sterner competition found amongst the California schools. They pay for the trip with the money earned from cleaning up

after their fellow Aggies.

Despite having dominated water polo in the Southwest for the past five years, only recently has the A&M team received the recognition it takes to attract more talent.

California is the nation's Mecca for swimmers and water polo players. Fosdick has been relatively successful, in his recruiting efforts in the Golden State as exactly half of his 22-man squad comes from California.

He says A&M's showing at the tourney will help recruiting.

"I had a hard time warming up the team because of the number of questions I tried to answer from kids interested in A&M," he said.

Not only youngsters became interested as several schools, such as Loyola and Pittsburgh, are considering adding A&M to their schedules on home-and-home basis. In the past, the Aggies had to supply the funds to travel and play against top-flight competition.

Texas A&M's team captains, Blake Hinman and Jim Yates, may make the American water polo team for

the World Student games, a year down Olympics. Hinman tied NCAA record by scoring nine goals in a single game, accomplishing against Pittsburgh.

Women win water polo championship

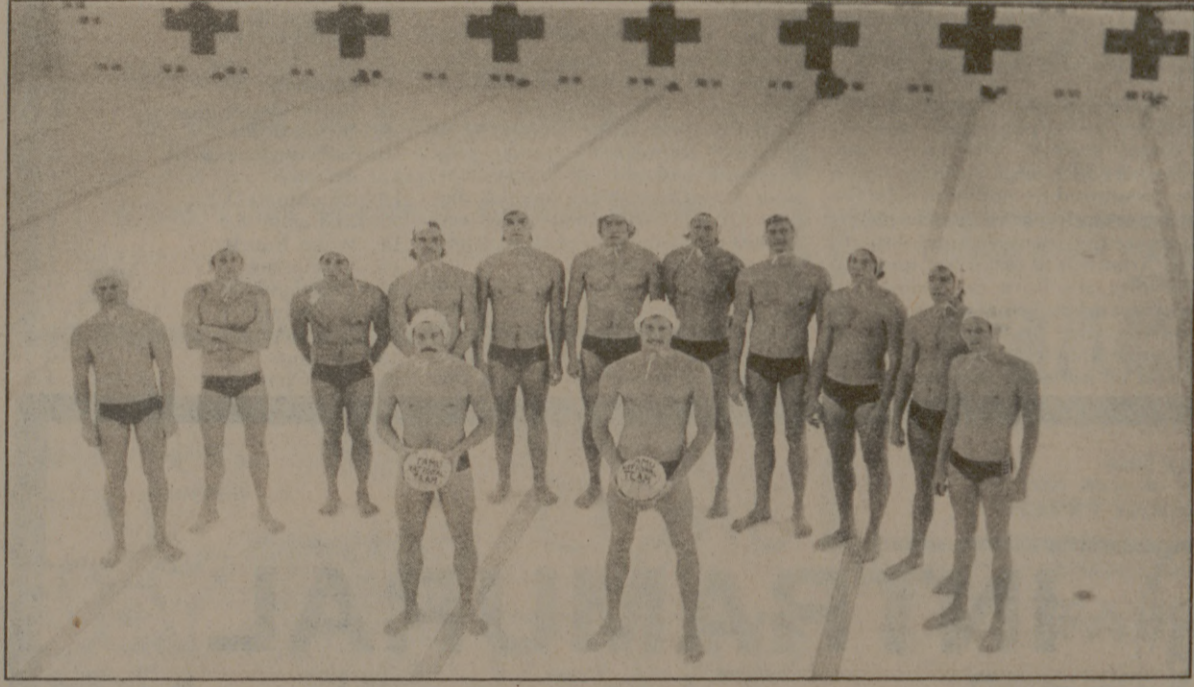
Texas A&M University women's Southwest Water Polo Championship for the second year. University of Arizona was second followed by Chapman International (San Antonio), Jacinto Water Polo Club (Harris County) and Brazos Valley Water Polo (College Station).

The championship game was a story of team momentum. The team defense by Arizona kept the Ags from getting their offense tracked in the first quarter with Susie Lynde scoring for A&M the same time, miscues in the defense and excellent passing team work by Arizona offense resulted in scores by Sue Sheehan, Kim Skinner and a pair by Hendricks to put them up 4-1.

In the second quarter Sheehan and Skinner each tallied and the devil defense kept A&M's goal muzzed, shutting out that part of the A&M game. However, Cindy Halleran rifled in a shot from the center to keep A&M in the game as the quarter ended with Arizona ahead 5-1.

When the second half started, it was a story of team momentum reversed. Vicki Brown scored for A&M as the Ags shut down the Arizona offense. Coach Dennis Light had his girls shooting from the side to counter the well coached Arizona slough on the hole. This trip was also taking its toll on the Arizona girls. The score at the end of the third quarter was 6-5, in Arizona's favor.

The momentum continued, however, in Texas A&M's favor in the fourth quarter. The Ags were a good job of shutting down the Arizona offense, while making a fast break after another. Dennis Starr broke free to tie the game 6-6. And then, as the clock ran, Mobley's Arizona charges the outside shot that struck the right-hand corner perfectly. Dennis Mobley's Arizona charges the back, but there just was not time on the clock. The final score A&M 7 - Arizona 6.

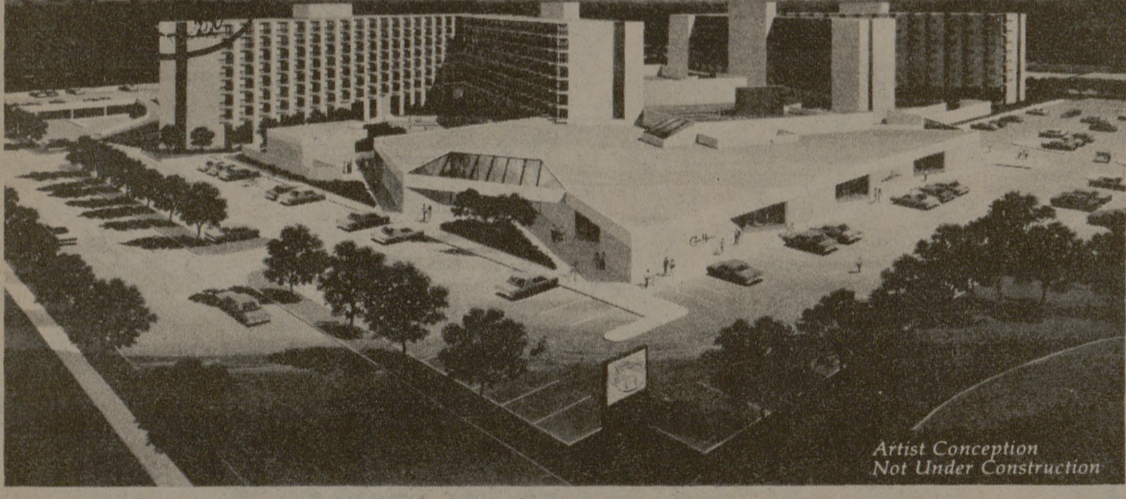
