San Jacinto halted by Aggies 99-71

Before playing the San Jacinto Ravens last Saturday night, it had been five weeks since the Texas A&M women's basketball team had suited up. But the rest did the women no harm as they raced past the Ravens of San Jacinto 99-71.

Led by Von Bunn's 19 points, the women jumped out to a 48-25 half time lead. Coach Kay Don then freely substituted in the second half, which eventually led to the entire squad scoring at least four points.

Four other women followed Bunn's double digit performance. They were Karen Musket who scored 13 points, Sally Morris who tallied 12 points, Denise Bettis who connected on 11 points and Margaret Byrne who added 10 more to the Aggie effort. The Aggies hit on 47 per cent of their shots from the field.

San Jacinto did not fare as well from the field, hitting only 34 per cent of the shots taken. Sherry Redwine and Lisa Angora led the Raven attack with 21 points apiece.

The statistic which led to the Raven's demise was turnovers. San Jacinto had 21 turnovers in the contest, while the Aggies had only 14. A&M also out rebounded the Ravens 47-44. Cindy Gough and Byrne pulled down eight apiece.

The encouraging thing about the victory is the fact that Coach Don allowed everyone to play. This experience will help some of the women who have not gotten to play as much when the Ags face tougher opposition.

The Aggies must face a tough opponent tonight as they travel to Nacogdoches to play Stephen F. Austin. The Ladyjacks are ranked tenth in the nation and have already beaten the Aggies once this season.

Swimmers stop Texas dominance

The Texas A&M women's swim team captured an unprecedented team championship at the University of Texas Invitational in Austin this past weekend. Texas' female tankers had never been defeated before the three-day competition.

The Aggies qualified seven women in nine events. Jeannie Buckles, Jennie Hicks, Shirley Hill, Julie Krienke, Susie Lynde, Stacey Pletz and Debbie Starr also combined their talents to set 16 A&M school records.

Debbie Starr was thankful for Coach Dennis Fosdick's encouragement on the final day of competition when the girls realized that they could win the meet.

"It was a stress situation all the way," Starr said. "Foz was behind us all the way."

Texas is still highly favored in the state meet in Houston of their depth, but the Aggies had unanimous support in saying they had finally won the respect of Texas swimmers.

Coach Fosdick went to the meet to see what he had to do and check out some of the teams. The Ags had been swimming over 10 miles a day since [the meet] did not taper for the meet. Fosdick cannot help but be with the team's performance.

As for the men's outdoor performance that it will be more individual performances due to the team's inexperience.

The men's team placed fourth in the Texas Invitational, behind Texas, LSU, and the University of Texas at Arlington.

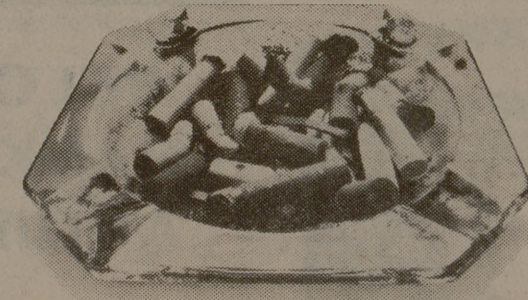

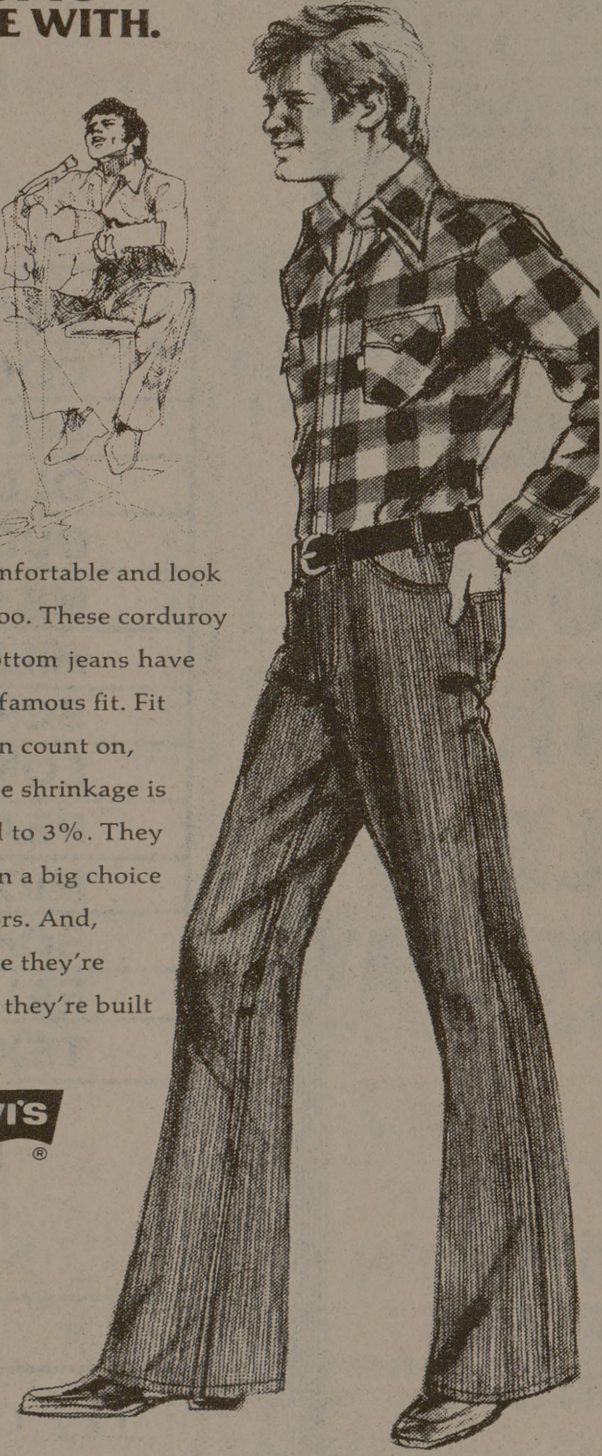
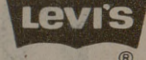
