A&M food program fully accredited

The American Dietetic Association has fully accredited Texas A&M University's foods and nutrition undergraduate program, announced Dean of Agriculture H. O. Kunkel.

University officials were notified by the association that the program's general, management and clinical specializations had all been approved.

The American Dietetic Association (ADA) holds responsibility for registering and licensing professional dietitians.

A&M's foods and nutrition program, an option degree offered through the horticultural sciences department, currently enrolls more than 60 undergraduate majors and will graduate its first students in May.

With ADA accreditation, these graduates may begin serving internships in Houston, San Antonio or Dallas in order to become registered dietitians.

"The total program requires in-

tership experience and we are seeking ways and means of accomplishing this," Kunkel said.

Certification of the program after three years of efforts by E. Burns, professor of food and technology at A&M.

Burns said tentative accreditation was given by the professional organization in September, 1976, that full accreditation was achieved just a week ago by ADA officials.

Aggie food and nutrition graduates will be unique in that the emphasis at A&M is on commercial aspects of dietetics. The tremendous growth of the food and food service industries created a great demand for registered dietitians, Burns said.

Accreditation of the program will allow Aggies to begin work into general and staff or consulting dietetic positions, administrative and management jobs in food service and spots in clinical food and nutrition research.
