

The Intramural Department operates and maintains several facilities across campus for the use of students, faculty, and staff members who want to participate

in recreational sports activities.
G. Rollie White Coliseum houses several different sports areas including a weightlifting room, wrestling room, and various basketball, volleyball, and badminton courts. These facilities are available for use Monday thru Friday from 4:00 to 12:00 p.m. and on Saturday and Sunday from 1:00 to 6:00 p.m. Student or faculty ID

cards are required to gain admission to the gym.

DeWare Fieldhouse, located adjacent to Kyle Field, houses racketball and handball courts, as well as a main basketball court.

The hours there are the same as G. Rollie White on weekdays but are from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on weekends. An ID is required

for this facility also.

[The weightlifting room is the only exception, being open on Monday through Friday, noon to 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 to 10:00 p.m., and on weekends from 3:00 to 5:00

p.m.]
The Tennis Courts, located behind Kyle Field, are available for use from 4:00 to 12:00 p.m. on Monday through Friday, and all day on the weekends. It is rec-ommended that anyone wishing to use the tennis, racketball, and handball courts make reservations by calling the IM Office at 845-2624, or by going by the office located at DeWare Fieldhouse.
