

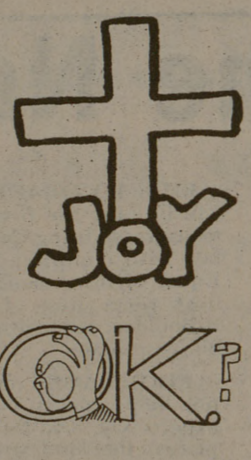

Carter urges WWII-type unity

WASHINGTON—In his first informal talk to the American people, President Carter called for a renewal of the fighting spirit of World War II to restore a sense of "common interest" that can help solve the nation's problems.
In his "fireside chat" last night,

Carter also outlined a vigorous agenda for cutting the number of high government officials, putting a ceiling on the number of government employees and moving to fulfill a host of campaign promises.
"With the help of my predecessor, we have come through a very difficult period in our nation's history. But for almost 10 years we have not had a sense of a common national interest," Carter said.

He will ask Congress this week for a bill allowing him to start reorganizing the federal government. He said the administration already is reviewing the 1,250 advisory committees and commissions to see how many can be abolished.

Recalling the unity and spirit of World War II, he added: "I believe we are ready for that same spirit again — to plan ahead, work to-

He said he has asked his Cabinet to follow his lead at the White House in cutting the number of top staffers by a third, and that he will put a ceiling on the number of persons employed by federal agencies.

Carter said he was "determined to have a strong, lean, efficient operating force," and added "I want our nation's actions to make you proud."

"We will continue to express our concern about violations of human rights, as we have during the week, without upsetting our efforts toward friendly relations with other countries," Carter said.

Administration programs to use southern campuses

The Southern Regional Training Program in Public Administration is now accepting applications for fellowships for the 1977-78 academic year. The program is designed to prepare students for careers in government and offers an opportunity for graduate study at two southern universities.

Those who are accepted into the program will serve a ten-week internship during the summer of 1977. Beginning about mid-July they will intern with a state, local or federal agency in the South. During the academic year, they will attend the Fall semester at either Alabama or Kentucky. All the interns will attend the Winter and Spring semesters at Tennessee.

The fellowships have a value of \$4,600, including \$1,300 in remission of fees and tuition. Married students receive a grant of \$400 in addition to the regular cash stipend of \$3,300.

Candidates must be American citizens who will have completed a bachelor's degree by June, 1977, with a specific major or area of study required. Fellowships are awarded on the basis of high academic achievement and a real interest in pursuing a public administration career in the South.

Students who qualify will study at the University of Tennessee and either the University of Alabama or the University of Kentucky. Upon completion of the program, they will receive a certificate in public administration. In addition, they will be eligible to complete an M.A. or M.P.A. degree at one of the institutions attended.

Enrollments have increased more than 2,000 since 1976

A spring semester record of 25,960 students are enrolled on the main campus of Texas A&M University, for an increase of more than 2,000 since the same period last year.

Registrar Robert A. Lacey said this semester's registration is 8.4 per cent higher than the 23,956 enrolled on the main campus last spring.
