A&M receives cash gifts
Two organizations have presented cash gifts of \$2,350 to Texas A&M University.
The Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce awarded the University two checks totaling \$1,300.
Chamber President Armand Frank gave a \$1,000 check to W. Clyde Freeman, the University's executive vice president and chief executive officer, and a \$300 check to Dean Raymond D. Reed of the College of Architecture Environmental Design.
Frank noted both gifts from the organization representing local merchants are presented on an unrestricted basis, allowing the University to use the money in support of programs for which state funds are not available.
The \$300 check for the College of Architecture and Environmental Design is part of the chamber's program of supporting individual colleges on a rotation basis. Several of the University's other colleges received similar support in the past, and the others are in line for such gifts.
A&M also received \$1,050 in grant money from the American Society of Safety Engineers (ASSE).
The presentations were made to Dr. Ned Walton, assistant dean of engineering and Dr. Richard Konzen, head of the Industrial Hygiene and Safety Engineering Division of the Department of Industrial Engineering at Texas A&M, for use as scholarships and for promotion and program development.
