

Mel Blanc to perform
Aggs to hear 'voice of animation'

The man behind the voices of Bugs Bunny, Tweety Pie, Speedy Gonzalez, Porky Pig and others brings humor to Texas A&M University Tuesday.
"An Evening with Mel Blanc" will be presented by Great Issues at 8 p.m. in the Rudder Auditorium.
A veteran of radio, animated car-

toons, recordings and television, Blanc has an international reputation.
Though Blanc's voices-for Sylvester, Daffy Duck and Pepe Le Pew have been around more than four decades, they are estimated still to be delighting 50 million persons daily throughout the world.
Great Issues Chairman Tracey O'Shay said admission to the program is free to A&M students with activity cards, and \$1 to all others.
The 69-year-old Blanc grew up in Portland, Ore., "entertaining students and teachers, getting big laughs and lousy grades." While a teenager he created the cackle later to become Woody Woodpecker.
Since 1961, Americans have also encountered the Blanc touch in commercials created by the staff of Mel Blanc Audiomeia for a variety of advertisers. The son of Mel and


Estelle Blanc, Noel, is president of the Hollywood firm.
In radio's heyday, Blanc worked with Jack Benny, Judy Canova, Abbott and Costello, and Burns Allen. From NBC to visual media, Blanc moved into television. "Taw a Puddy Tat" and "The Woodpecker Song," each sold two million records.
In TV, Blanc created a number of unusual voice characters for children's educational shows. "The Peep Show."
A serious 1961 auto accident in West Los Angeles hairpin curve broke almost every bone in his body, put him in a coma for 21 days and a full body cast for a year. He has it that when Blanc came out of the coma his first words were "what's up Doc?"

Medications differ for each flu patient

Why are medications given for the flu so different from patient to patient? R.C.
Although all flu patients may seem to be suffering from the same symptoms, each case is usually different.
"There are obviously many different medications that accomplish basically the same purpose," said Dr. Claude Goswick, director of Beutel Health Center.
"Antibiotics would be given to

some patients to prevent secondary infections," he said. "Disinfectants would be an example."
Different medications are given to those with high fevers, prominent headaches, he said.
Some students prefer medications that do not contain tylenol so they will not get drowsy in class, Goswick added.
