Students warned of energy source shifts

Nuclear engineers may not find jobs

A professional engineer warned 2,000 Texas high school students Friday not to eagerly enter into the field of nuclear engineering because 80 per cent of America's energy would come from atomic sources by the year 1990.

"We will need more electrical engineers, civil engineers and chemical engineers, because everything we have will probably have to be remodeled or replaced in the next 15 years," said Dr. Howard Wakeland, associate dean of engineering at the University of Illinois. He is also president of the Junior Engineering Technical Society (JETS).

Wakeland, addressing the state JETS conference at Texas A&M University, said energy was number one challenge to engineering.

He told the students the world has made major energy shifts every 40 years for the past 200 years, so there was no reason to panic at the thought of the running out of both petroleum and coal resources by year 2050.

Alumni donations set record more than \$2.4 million

Contributions to Texas A&M University's Association of Former Students last year totaled a record \$2,427,830, up more than \$1 million from the previous year.

Buck Weirus, the association's executive director, said gifts were received from 27,352 donors.

The previous year, the alumni organization received \$1,380,871 from 22,118 donors.

Comparative 1976 figures from other universities are not yet available, but Weirus speculated that A&M may now rank first in the world in alumni giving. In the recent listings of universities, the top alumni support was trailed only the University of Michigan, which has about 100,000 former students.

Weirus said that sharp increase can be partially attributed to the fact that 1976 was the University's centennial year. Also, a new survey of former students was published last year, an event that traditionally spurs contributions, he added.

Any student who fails the written examination (EPE) must satisfy the English proficiency requirement by taking English 301 and earning a minimum grade of C.

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE
OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year in residence, credit for at least ninety-two (92) semester hours and be in good standing with the University. A year in residence may consist of the Fall and Spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session (both the first and second terms). The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on March 23rd may be used in satisfying this ninety-two hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building. This should be done prior to March 23rd in order for all records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. (Any student having completed ninety-two (92) hours at the end of the Fall '76 semester may order at any time. There is never a dead-line once the hours have been completed, with the exception of a monthly mailing date.) Graduate students are eligible to order with proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation.

Orders for mid-semester will be taken by the ring clerk starting March 23, 1977, and will continue until April 26, 1977. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Please bring mid-semester grade reports along when ready to order. Anyone having failed to leave their names in advance and fail to bring grade report will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked. The rings should arrive at the Registrar's Office on June 28, 1977. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 23rd or April 26th will arrive at the same time.

The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m.


