Oil divestiture views differ

DALLAS — One expert said it was a step toward socialism, but another called it a boost to the free market economy. A third said it was as American as apple pie.

A fourth expert, however, said even Armageddon would be postponed with the divestiture of the world's oil companies.

"I can't even believe we even have to discuss divestiture," Dr.

William Johnson, former senior economist for the President's Council of Economic Advisors, told delegates to the 56th Annual Gas Processors Association Convention.

"The act is so patently bad that I can't even believe we have not just scrapped the idea as unworkable. But on the eve of Armageddon there will be those who will shout — 'Let's break up the oil companies and all our problems will be solved.'"

Johnson said divestiture was a "mindless massacre" of the oil industry, while another, Michael T. Halbouty, said divestiture was an attack on the free market.

"We've already had proposals to establish a national oil and gas company," Halbouty said. "Make no mistake about it. The structure is freedom. Will the oil industries remain free to diversify, to find new uses for their resources, to produce more of the goods and services our people need? It's a question of whether or not we will have a free market economy."

Rutgers University economist Paul Davidson disagreed with Halbouty and Johnson, saying divestiture "is as American as apple pie."

It is not a question of communism or even socialism, he said. "It is a question of whether or not we will have a free market economy."

He said horizontal divestiture would not significantly alter the technological progress that creates research incentives.

"I know most of you will be hard to accept but divestiture is a worthy policy to pursue. You can live with horizontal divestiture."

Walter S. Messersmith, an economist for the Senate committee on antitrust and competition, said horizontal divestiture would guarantee a free market.

"In a significant sector of the economy, such as the oil and gas market, coal and steel, are competitive with oil and gas," he said. "It is important to have companies which dominate a source not be permitted to dominate in potentially competitive sources."

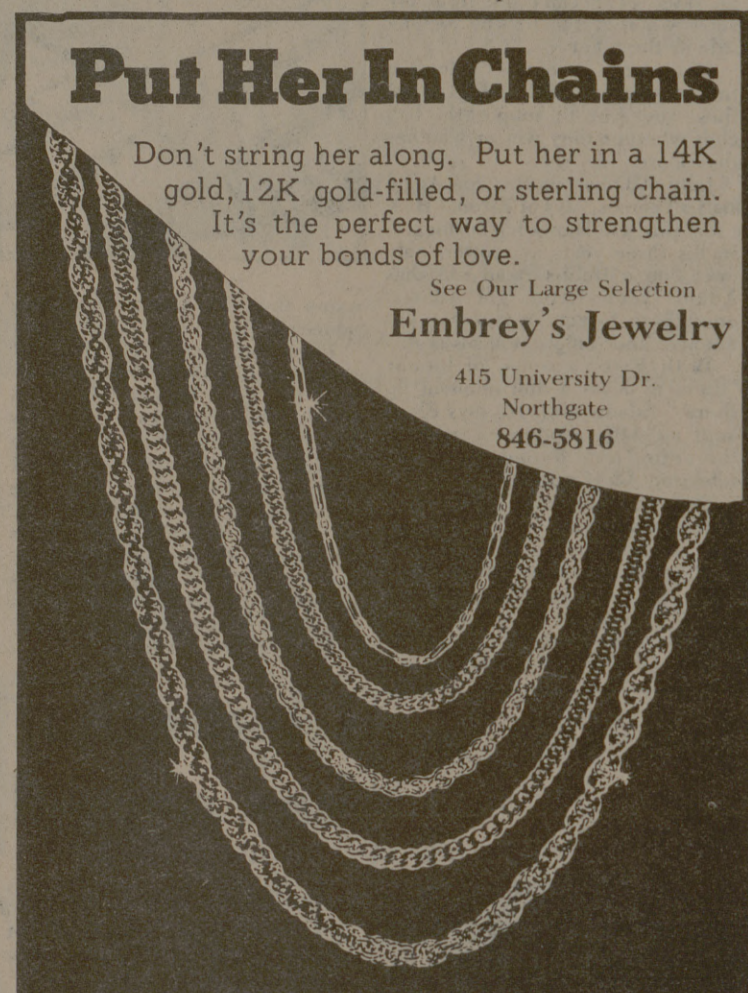
"The supporters of divestiture are not radicals. They are truly conservative believers in the virtue of a free enterprise economy."

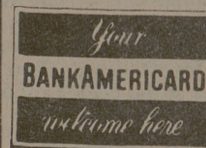

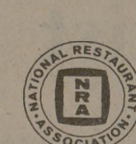
