'Up With People' pleases crowd

The stage came alive with colorful figures swirling to the music. They set the mood for a lively "Up With People" production last night in the Bryan Civic Auditorium.

The auditorium was filled with a crowd ranging from preschoolers to grandparents, and they all went home with hands sore from clapping. But the clapping belied some portions of the production.

The audience didn't seem to mind and applauded enthusiastically for that number and throughout the show, later giving the group two standing ovations.

The cast, one of six "Up With People" productions performing internationally, had been to Bryan High School and A&M Consolidated earlier this week.

Anyone between 18 and 25-years of age can try out for "Up With People" after one of their shows.

"You don't need to dance, you don't need to sing," Will Allen, a cast member from Long Beach, Calif., said. "You just need good thinking. You have to be very open minded."

Texas Senate restricts catch

AUSTIN — The Texas Senate approved a bill limiting the daily catch of redfish. The bill's sponsor says it is needed to keep the fish from becoming extinct.

The bill by Sen. A. R. Schwartz, D-Galveston, was passed yesterday and sent to the House. It would force commercial redfish fishermen to get

licenses and would reduce the take.

The bill limits the daily catch of redfish to 200 pounds per boat per day for the first 60 days of the year, and State Parks and Wildlife Commission authority to set higher limits in future years.

Schwartz said the bill would require a permitted harvest of 10 million pounds of fish during the

For information and guidelines on the nature of the examination, consult with the departmental secretary.

In order to qualify as a candidate for a degree in the College of Science, each student must demonstrate an ability to express himself (or herself) in acceptable English. This requirement may be satisfied by (1) passing an examination in English composition (EPE) taken not later than the spring semester of the junior year, or (2) completing English 301 with a minimum grade of C.

Any student who fails the written examination (EPE) must satisfy the English proficiency requirement by taking English 301 and earning a minimum grade of C.

SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE

OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS
To be eligible to order the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year in residence, credit for at least ninety-two (92) semester hours and be in good standing with the University. A year in residence may consist of the Fall and Spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session (both the first and second terms). The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on March 23rd may be used in satisfying this ninety-two hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building, during the period from March 23rd to March 25th in order for all records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. (Any student having completed ninety-two (92) hours at the end of the Fall '76 semester may order at any time. There is never a dead-line once the hours have been completed, with the exception of a monthly mailing date.) Graduate students are eligible to order with proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation.

Orders for mid-semester will be taken by the ring clerk starting March 25, 1977, and will continue until April 26, 1977. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. All rings must be paid for in full when the ring is placed. Please bring mid-semester grade reports along when ready to order. Anyone having failed to leave their names in advance and fail to bring grade report will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked. The rings should arrive at the Registrar's Office on June 28, 1977. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 23rd or April 26th will arrive at the same time.

The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. We hope this information will be helpful and extend our congratulations.

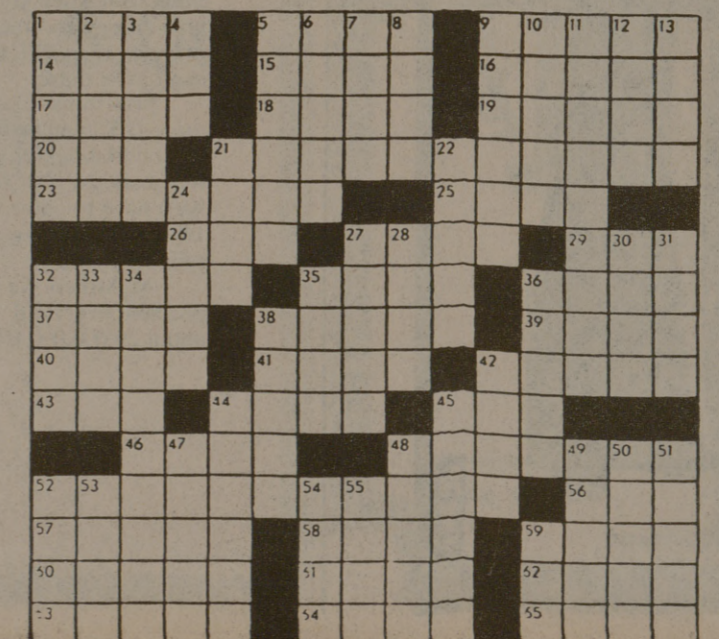
