

Hope for nationals

Ag women host track meet

Texas A&M's women's track and field team will host six other universities and some 17 high schools in the Texas A&M Relays at Kyle Field this Saturday.

The University of Texas, Houston, Sam Houston State, Stephen F. Austin, Southwest Texas State and University of Oklahoma will be competing against A&M in the university division.

Bryan High School and A&M Consolidated will compete in the high school division. Running event prelims for the universities begin at 10 a.m., while high school running event prelims start at noon.

Field event finals in the university class start at 10 a.m. and high school field event finals begin at 11:30 a.m.



Cornelius is A&M's best hope in the sprints, Williams said. Her match-up against the University of Houston's Stephanie Brown in the 220-yard dash will be a key race, he said.

The Aggies' success in the distance runs will depend heavily on the performance of sophomore Martha Sartain. She holds A&M's best times in the mile, two-mile and three-mile runs.

The Aggies expect to do well in both the two mile and 440-yard relays. If it isn't too windy Saturday, Coach Williams says his two mile relay team has a good chance of qualifying for Nationals.

Running in the two mile relay for A&M will be Jackie Soward, Julie White, Trena Burgess and Cathy Cocker.

White, Cornelius, Cindy Bartlett and Sande Lambert will compete in the 440-yard relay.

So far this season, five Aggies have qualified for Nationals: Linda Cornelius (long jump), Iris Tipton (shot put), Sandra Lyman (discus), Jan Chesbro (high jump) and Martha Sartain (three mile run).

Coach Williams said he expects others will qualify for Nationals before the season is over.

Next week the Aggies will travel to Norman, Okla. to compete in the University of Oklahoma Invitational.

Julie White will lead the women's track team this Saturday at the Texas A&M Relays at Kyle Field. Six other universities will be competing against the Aggies.

Soccer team finishes second in tournament

The Texas A&M soccer team took second place in the St. Mary's International Soccer Tournament last weekend.

A&M beat American High School Mexico City on Friday, in the first of their three games. Halfback Paul Oliver scored first for the Ag's on 10-yards out. After a foul, Steve Mayer scored on a penalty kick to put the Ag's up 2-0. The Mexican team rallied in the second half, but the final score was 2-1.

On Saturday, the Ag's lost to St. Mary's University 7-2. Down 4-0 at halftime, A&M's goals came on penalty kicks by Mayer. This game was virtually the championship,

since the other teams had lost at least one game apiece.

The Ag's rebounded from the disappointing loss, and out-passed Trinity University 8-1 on Sunday, to take tournament second place. Goals were scored by Oliver, Mayer, Andy Case, David Harmon, Farhang Feshari, Arturo Wolf, and Scott Stucky with two.

The tournament was the first for A&M this semester. In preparation, the Ag's scrimmaged U of H, losing 1-0 on a penalty kick and beat Rice 3-1.

The A&M team will play Baylor this Saturday at 2:00 p.m. on the soccer field at the intramural complex across Wellborn Road.

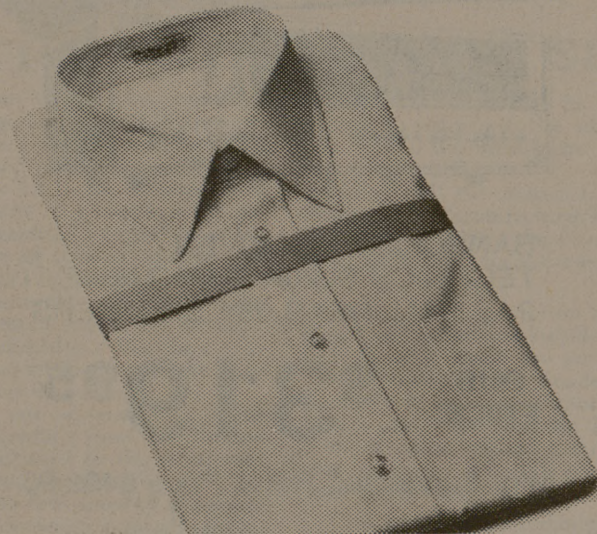
