**SENIOR RING ORDERING PROCEDURE**  
OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS

To be eligible to order the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year in residence, credit for at least ninety-two (92) semester hours and be in good standing with the University. A year in residence may consist of the Fall and Spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session (both the first and second terms). The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on March 23rd may be used in satisfying this ninety-two hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, Room Seven, Richard Coke Building. This should be done prior to March 23rd in order for all records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. (Any student having completed ninety-two (92) hours at the end of the Fall '76 semester may order at any time. There is never a deadline once the hours have been completed, with the exception of a monthly mailing date.) Graduate students are eligible to order with proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation. Orders for mid-semester rings will be taken by the ring clerk starting March 23, 1977, and will continue until April 26, 1977. Students who do not place their order during this period may order after final grades are posted. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Please bring mid-semester grade reports along when ready to order. Anyone having failed to leave their names in advance and fail to bring grade reports will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked. The rings should arrive at the Registrar's Office on June 29, 1977. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 23rd or April 26th will arrive at the same time. The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. We hope this information will be helpful and extend our congratulations.

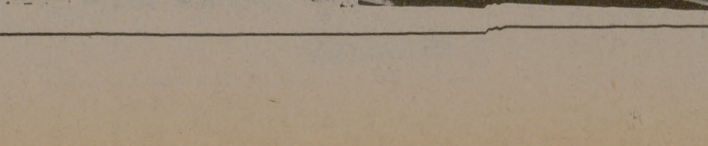

## Centennial film places first A&M receives six top honors for University publication

Texas A&M University won six top awards in publications and news competition sponsored by the Southwest District of the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) — twice as many as any institution. It also received six other citations.  
More than 650 brochures, news stories, films, tapes and related items were entered in competition by 69 institutions in Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma and New Mexico.  
Sharing in A&M's awards were Educational Information Services, Office of Admissions and Records, Development Office and University News Service.

A&M placed first in the film category with "That Certain Spirit," a documentary produced in conjunction with the University's centennial. It also placed first in the news and information division of communications programs for coverage of centennial activities.  
Two first-place awards were given for A&M publications. The University's new freshman brochure was judged the best entry in general information literature, and a pamphlet prepared for KAMU-TV, the campus-based educational television station, won in the category for development brochures.

Presented another first-place award for "Perspective," a weekly radio program distributed through stations throughout the state.  
A&M also received the award given for internal communications. The entry included Fortnightly and Personnel News publications designed for faculty and staff, and the University's organizational chart.  
A second-place award was presented under a special category for a case study outlining A&M's year-long centennial activities.  
The University also received three third-place awards — catalogs; advertising; a layout of the University Development Foundation; and television, a film describing work on the centennial wood carvings.

Honorable mentions were received under categories for planning, a series of color photographs for the 1976 football program, and general news stories.  
Other multiple award winners were the University of Texas at Austin, Texas Tech University, Phillips University, which placed each, Rice University and Tulane University had two each.  
CASE is a national organization of university personnel engaged in publications, news, development and alumni affairs.
