

Efficiency saves energy

Homeowners planning to buy or build a home can save on utility costs by incorporating energy-efficient equipment and appliances. A publication issued by the Texas Energy Efficiency Center, the "Plain Talk About Buying an Energy-Efficient Home" is available to interested Texans. It discusses major areas of concentration to save home energy efficiency — resistance, attic ventilation, package reduction and efficient

heating systems (air conditioning, heating, water heating, etc.). "A great deal of home energy conservation material being distributed today is designed mainly for colder, northern climates," says D. Stephen Riter, director of the EAST program at A&M. "Our publication concentrates on energy conservation devices and techniques particularly suited to the Texas climate. For instance, the largest energy consumer in many Texas homes is the air conditioning unit, not the heating unit as in northern areas."

The information for the publication was compiled by Walter Patterson, assistant professor of building construction at A&M. For much of the past year, he has been working with builders, architects and consumers to encourage energy efficiency in homes. Patterson says that over a long-term mortgage, a homeowner's increased monthly payments for the added costs of building in energy-efficient equipment will be more than recovered through smaller monthly utility bills.

Homes which use less energy will be an even better investment if residential fuel and electricity rates rise as expected in future years. A recent report by the Federal Energy Administration indicates residential fuel costs likely will nearly double by 1985. 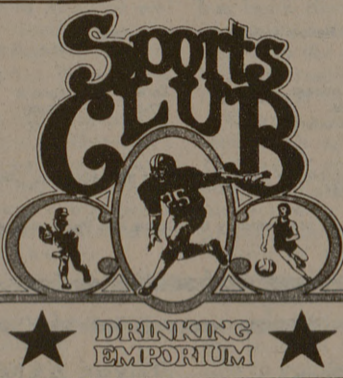
