

Carter pushes \$50 rebate

WASHINGTON — President Carter is going to bat for his proposed \$50 a person rebate in the face of zealous Republican opposition and lukewarm Democratic support in the Senate.

Press Secretary Jody Powell said yesterday Carter feels the proposal is "extremely important" to economic recovery.

Powell told reporters yesterday "we recognize passage of the tax rebate is not... automatic," but insisted that it has the majority support of the American people.

"Although there are numerous bases on which one could take exception to it," Powell said, "no one has been able to come up with a

plan to give an immediate boost to the economy..."

"So it is the President's belief this proposal is extremely important to recovery," he added.

Senate Republican leader Howard Baker said he thinks there is an "excellent chance" that the House-passed tax rebate will be defeated in the Senate with solid GOP opposition.

But Senate Democratic Leader Robert Byrd disagreed. "As of now, the tax rebate will carry," Byrd said.

Sources close to the Democratic leadership said they cannot see more than 40 votes against the rebate.

The main opposition to the rebate apparently comes from a feeling that it will do little good in stimulating the economy. Many also are upset that the Treasury must borrow \$10.5 billion to pay for it.

Fabric Care News
Helpful Hints From Your Dry-Cleaner
• Read and save all clothing labels, tags and sales slips until garment has been laundered or dry cleaned at least once.
• Don't use hot water on blood or other protein stains.
• Water of any temperature will set ball point ink.
• Never store vinyl, leather or suede garments in plastic bags.
• Never store soiled or stained clothing. The stains will set and also attract insects.
• Check the interfacing on mens and womens suit lapels before buying. Many have bonded interfacing instead of sewn and will pucker and wrinkle permanently when cleaned.
• Use only cold water when laundering 100% acrylics or polyesters. Hot water will make them stretch permanently.
• Do not attempt to remove stains from corduroy, velvet or flocked garments by rubbing or scrubbing. Doing so will remove the nap.
• Be careful in storing garments in plastic bags for any length of time, especially during the summer. Heat may adhere the plastic to the fabric.
• Before buying leather or suede garments, check for imperfections in the leather caused by injuries to the animal from barbed wire, kicks from other animals, licks and other insect bites. These scars become apparent as soon as some of the leather dye fades.
