There is always room for improvement.

As for accelerated students, this year, for the first time, we have fully state-funded resource teachers at the elementary and middle schools and then we have a special program at the high school that the University has research funds for.

But we need to reach more children because we have more who qualify than we are able to provide for.

What do you plan to do about improving the maintenance of physical facilities?

I want to see quality in the construction program because just one error in the area of capital outlay would cost us enough to underwrite all of the special programs that have been questioned recently.

I think that if we insist on quality in both construction and what goes on inside the walls after they are

built that we'll be in good shape.

What do you think could be done to improve the safety and quality of present playground facilities?

A lot. There can be a lot done with the free and inexpensive materials that involves fathers on a Saturday. In a way, those are sometimes the most imaginative because many times the fancy and expensive equipment the children tend to boycott.

The other that is nicely designed and kind of unique attracts them.

How do you feel about current taxation methods and how do you feel it could be improved?

Basically, the taxation is a state issue. Citizens interested in correcting this will have to take the trouble to become informed and work for change at the state level because ad valorem taxes are regressive and abominable.

As for what adjustments can be made on our own local budget, I do not think we are out of line as far as the amount expended per pupil.

Most districts receive quite a lot more federal funding that we do not qualify for so we do have to put more local funds into it. This hurts us. The only industry we have is the Texas A&M campus and it is not taxable. So it falls on the residential and rural property owners.

rent taxation methods and how do you feel it could be improved?

Well, of course, taxing is always a sore spot. I think mostly the replacement of the ad valorem tax altogether.

Of course this would be legislative, it's on the state level, if this is to be done. But, outside of that, the best we can do is to work toward a fully equated equalization of the base.

There has been a great deal of progress made in this respect, in fact it's just about finished.

I believe that we should continue our efforts in both of those areas. We do have an exceptional program, or series of programs, for our exceptional students, and I think these should be continued.

I think that we have a good maintenance program now.

I think that some of these need to be replaced with splinters and that sort of thing.

How do you feel about current taxation methods and how do you feel it could be improved?

Well, I feel personally that ad valorem tax is probably the most unfair taxes that we have. It places very definite handicaps on some individuals in the school system. Particularly people with incomes and agricultural productivity. Several bills in the legislature which will probably, eventually, alleviate this problem.

What do you plan to do about improving the maintenance of physical facilities?

We have, at the present, a very extensive maintenance program underway.

Before this program was started, maintenance was almost nonexistent. I think we have an excellent program now, but it is not possible to fix up everything at once.

What do you think could be done to improve the safety and quality of present playground facilities?

I'm not sure that they need as far as the quality is concerned, it might be worth trying to get a stand of grass on them this summer.

We just have to have an excellent maintenance program.

How do you feel about current rent taxation method and how do you feel it could be improved?

I think that our tax office is probably as poor as there is in the state. I disagree, fundamentally, with the idea of taxing automobiles. I think the other school districts in the state don't do it.

Our tax assessor already thinks they (cars) ought to be taxed for equity. Well, the fact is, we won't all be taxed, so what's the table about that?

So far as I'm concerned, we need to rearrange the method of appraisal at the values of the properties in the school district by hopefully solidating the appraisal office of the City of College Station.

So, we won't need all the people in the tax office. And we do have some competent people in the office that should be kept on to handle the billing and collection. That's all that is necessary.

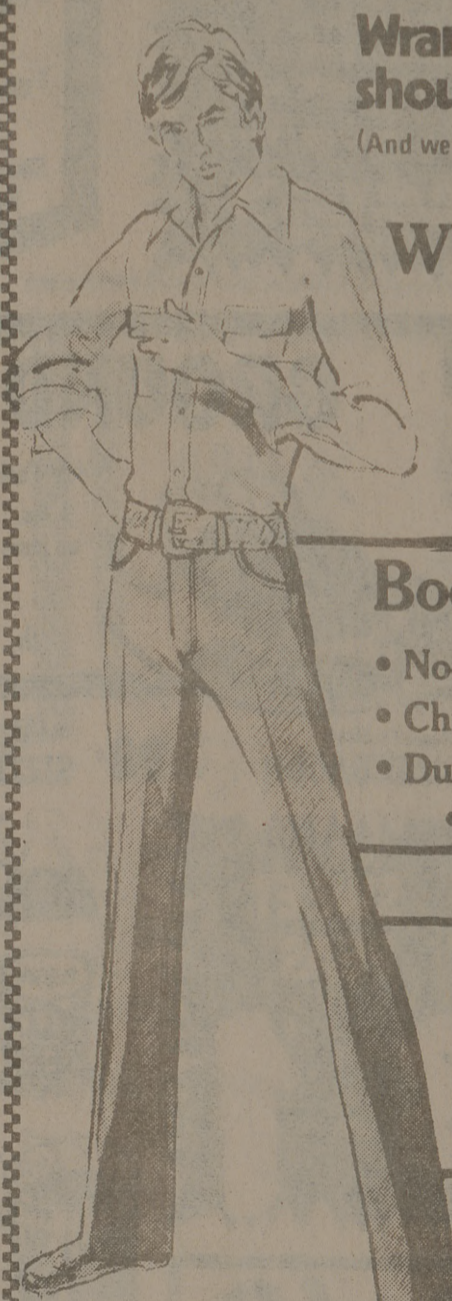
