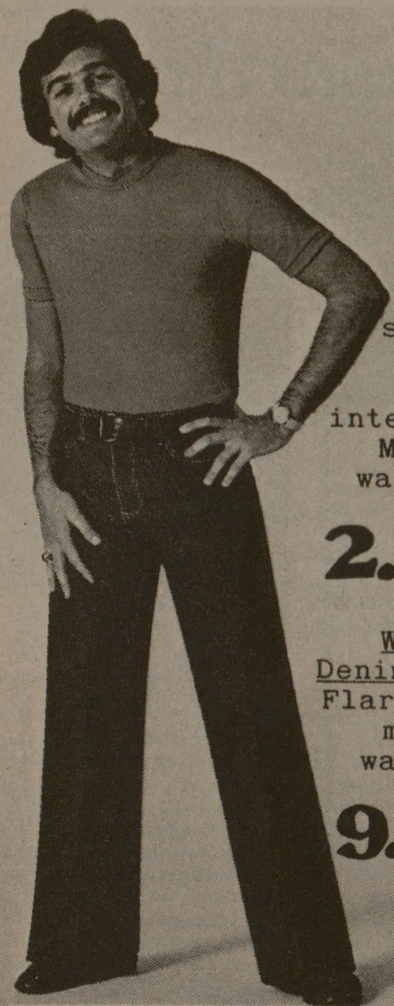

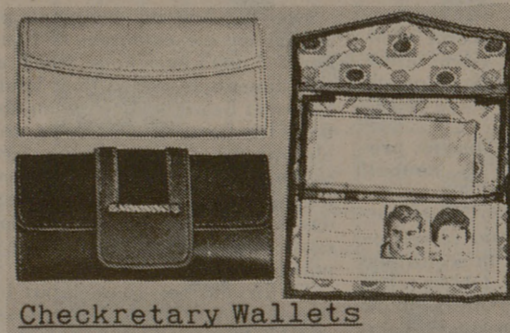

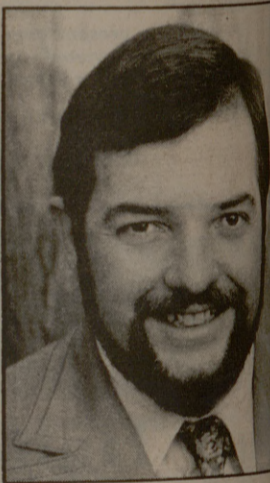
What do you consider to be the highest priorities of the board?

Rodney C. Hill, 37, 119 Lee, associate professor at Texas A&M University.

Why do you think you are qualified to hold a position on the school board?

I have a bachelor's in architecture and a master's in social and behavioral factors in architecture. I have been teaching for about 10 years now. Before I started teaching, I was working in Dallas and Houston on about \$75 million worth of buildings and developments. This included five schools, all of which were built within the allowed budget.
