Former Beatles manager indicted

NEW YORK — The former manager of the Beatles has been indicted on charges he evaded taxes on income he received the sale of Beatles promotional records usually distributed free to jockeys and reviewers.

Allen Klein, 46, of New York, president of ABKCO Industries, Inc., was charged by a federal grand jury with evading \$125,615 in taxes on \$216,761 in unreported income for the three years from 1974 to 1976.

The indictment alleged Klein's group's last manager up to the breakup several years ago, took in a scheme to sell the promotional records to record wholesalers, members and distributors.

If convicted, Klein faces up to three years in prison and fines of \$15,000.
