

"For years Texas has pioneered more new and successful drilling, exploration, production, and secondary and tertiary recovery techniques than any other state or nation in the world," Langdon said.

Beginning about 25 years ago, the Texas Petroleum Research Committee (which operates at A&M) wrote the pioneering papers showing the effect of increase in oil recovery and the effects of fractures on water flooding in secondary regas through fractured wells.

'Many of you are aware that liquefied natural gas is being imported into the U.S. to provide supplemental energy needed in the Northeast," he said. "But, probably few of you know that 18 years ago the TPRC wrote what was perhaps the first paper proposing the liquefaction of natural gas and its transport to
