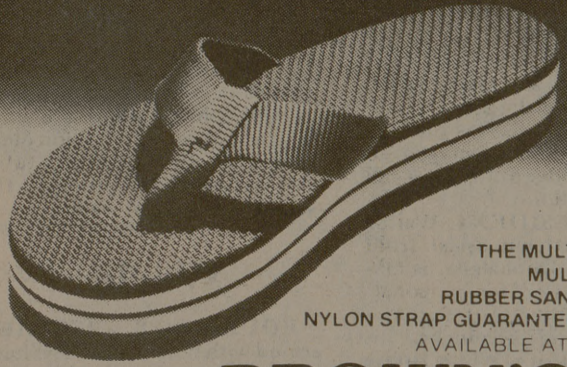

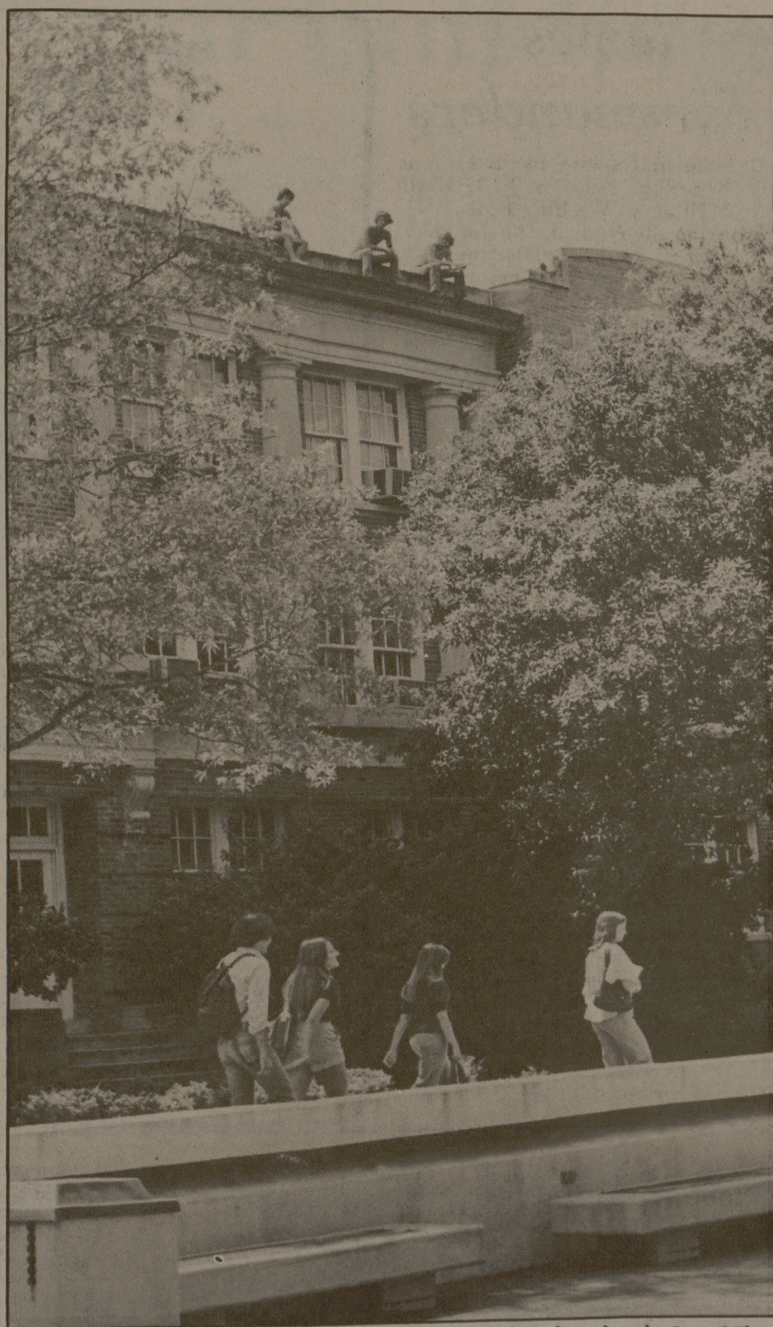

**Assault using dog — a first**

TORRINGTON, Wyo. — Sheriff's deputies are still trying to figure out why a truck driver brought his dog into a bar and threw it at the bartender.

"Assault with a dog — I think that's a first," said Joe Heid, Goshen County sheriff's deputy.

"It's not out of the ordinary for someone to bring a dog into the bar. He just picked it up and threw it at her — just like Happy Days. The guy was pretty well down

the road drinking," Heid said. "But we couldn't really figure out why he got mad at the bartender.

In addition to the charge involving the dog, Leo Froelich 29, of Newcastle, Wyo., was charged with resisting arrest an insulting an officer. He was released on bond earlier this week when he stopped refusing to be fingerprinted.

The dog, a 25-30 pound part German shepherd, survived the incident intact.

**Railroad commissioner notes  
A&M's research on energy**

Texas Railroad Commissioner Jim C. Langdon noted major Texas A&M University research contributions toward solving the energy crisis during a speech at the West Texas Chamber of Commerce Convention in Midland.

"For years Texas has pioneered more new and successful drilling, exploration, production, and secondary and tertiary recovery techniques than any other state or nation in the world," Langdon said.

"Beginning about 25 years ago, the Texas Petroleum Research Committee (which operates at A&M) wrote the pioneering papers showing the effect of increase in oil recovery and the effects of fractures on water flooding in secondary re-

covery programs," he said. "Applying this technology, Texas oil operators have produced in excess of \$10 billion worth of additional oil and gas through fractured wells."

"Many of you are aware that liquefied natural gas is being imported into the U.S. to provide supplemental energy needed in the Northeast," he said. "But, probably few of you know that 18 years ago the TPRC wrote what was perhaps the first paper proposing the liquefaction of natural gas and its transport to energy deprived areas."

"Recently, research has led to new TPRC-authored papers proposing the injection of air at pressures to achieve displacement of oil," Langdon added. "Keep in mind that

Texas has approximately 30 billion barrels of unrecoverable oil. Presently may become recoverable with employment of this technology."

Dr. Paul Crawford, assistant director of TPRC, said that research only two per cent would be worth an additional one billion barrels for the Texas economy.

"In addition to the value of research, more than 600 students (450 of them from Texas) have been trained in technology increasing oil and gas recovery working on TPRC projects," Langdon said. "We believe it represents the best interest of the road Commission and the best of all Texans."

**Greeks to hold Derby Week**

Throughout the week the teams have been presenting skits for the members of Sigma Chi. A panel of judges rates them on performance, creativity, originality, group interest, spirit and theme. This year's theme is the Old South.

The climax of the week, Derby Day, will be held Saturday at noon in Tanglewood Park. The public is invited.

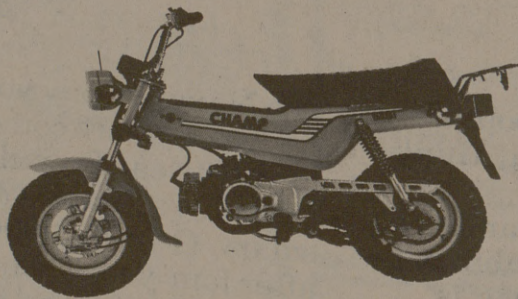
