Texas weather data indicates last winter coldest since 1941

Was last winter the coldest for the state of Texas?

Results are now coming in from the National Climatic Center in Ashville, N.C., where the state's winter weather data was compiled. The center's computers are tryng

to make some sense out of reports from 10 separate climatic divisions. Glen Lubiens, who works at Texas A&M in the office of State Climatologist Dr. John Griffiths, showed evidence that this has been

1941, beating even the winter of 1972-73 by .8 degrees of mean average temperature.

The average mean temperature for this winter in Texas — the February and March figures aren't in yet

— was a chilly 44 degrees. Last November's average of 48.3 degrees was tied in 1972, the December low of 45 degrees was beat by a 41.7 average in 1963, and January's icy 39.1 degrees was the state's coldest since 37 degrees in the coldest winter since at least




