In the eighth, Grobe and Hurdle both walked and Hawthorne knocked in the two final scores with a double.


Texas' game in Arkansas was rained out Saturday and postponed until Sunday.


The Razorbacks' lone run was unearned, gained after Arvis Harper struck out, but reached first base on a passed ball. He scored on two Arkansas singles.






