## Bill would okay beer import House approves money for 18 water projects

AUSTIN — Australian beer can be imported into Texas if the House goes along with a bill passed by the Senate yesterday.

Sen. Ron Clower, D-Carland, won approval on a voice vote to permit sales in Texas of imported beer sold by the liter instead of ounces.

Clower's bill would require the imported beer to be sold in containers of a size that deviates no more than 5 per cent from the sizes of bottles and cans currently permitted in Texas.

WASHINGTON — The House voted yesterday to authorize \$1.2 billion to continue construction on 18 water projects, including two that President Carter tried to stop.

The measure, passed on a 310-89 vote and sent to the Senate, would authorize \$459 million for the Mississippi River and Tributaries project, including the Cache River Basin project in Arkansas which Carter said should be terminated.

\$170 million is authorized for the Missouri River Basin project which includes the Hillsdale Lake project in Kansas, another that Carter said should be ended.

This year Carter reviewed 32 water projects already authorized and partially funded by Congress, then recommended funds be cut off for 18 of them worth \$2.5 billion. He said they were wasteful and other opponents called them part of the traditional congressional "pork barrel."

Farmers and other supporters of the project say their construction means survival, and the difference between profit and loss for those who live on flood plains.

On May 3, a House subcommittee voted to provide money for the 18 anyway, and White House Press Secretary Jody Powell would not rule out the possibility that Carter would veto a bill preserving some of the projects.

In addition to the two on Carter's "hit list," The House authorized construction funds for:  
Alabama-Coosa River basin, \$1 million; Arkansas River basin, \$1 million; Brazos River basin, \$8 million; Central and Southern Florida, \$9 million; Columbia River basin, \$77 million; North River basin, \$75 million; Susquehanna River basin, \$75 million; Ohio River basin, \$60 million; Quachita River basin, \$2 million; Red River waterway project, \$1 million; San Joaquin River, \$125 million; Santa Ana River, \$3 million; South Platte River, \$30 million; Tampa Harbor, \$1 million; Upper Mississippi River basin, \$2 million; and White River basin, \$2 million.

In a separate action, the House voted 390-6 to approve a bill authorizing \$5.9 million for the Resources Council which directs river basin planning in areas without management commissions. The measure was sent to the Senate.
