



Bill would okay beer import House approves money for 18 water projects

WASHINGTON — The House voted yesterday to authorize \$1.2 billion to continue construction on 18 water projects, including two that President Carter tried to stop.

The measure, passed on a 310-89 vote and sent to the Senate, would authorize \$459 million for the Mississippi River and Tributaries project, including the Cache River Basin project in Arkansas which Carter said should be terminated. \$170 million is authorized for the

Missouri River Basin project which includes the Hillsdale Lake project in Kansas, another that Carter said should be ended. This year Carter reviewed 32 water projects already authorized and partially funded by Congress,

then recommended funds be cut off for 18 of them worth \$2.5 billion. He said they were wasteful and other opponents called them part of the traditional congressional "pork
