Suter appointed associate dean

Dr. Dwayne A. Suter, who on September 1 will become associate dean for instruction in the Texas A&M University College of Agriculture, will assume additional duties as coordinator of the academic programs in food science and technology, effective immediately.

In making the announcement, Dr. H. O. Kunkel, A&M's dean of agriculture, said Suter's principal new duties will include chairmanship of the faculty of food sciences and technology in the College of Agriculture and coordination of instructional programs. This assignment will continue beyond September 1, Kunkel said.

Suter, who has served as associate professor of food engineering with the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and the Department of Agricultural Engineering since 1972, in September will fill the position of associate dean for instruction that has been held by Dr. R.C. Potts for the past nine years.

Graves selected for management training seminar

Texas A&M graduate Dr. James Graves of El Paso has been chosen to participate in a U.

S. Army Material Development and Readiness Command management training program.

An operations research analyst at White Sands Missile Range, N. M., Graves is among 70 Command employees chosen for the program.

Graves, who completed his Ph.D. in math here in 1971, has worked in industry and taught at Texas A&M.

Hall appointed department head

Dr. Charles F. Hall, Experiment Station scientist in poultry pathology, has been appointed head of the Department of Veterinary Microbiology in Texas A&M University's College of Veterinary Medicine.

He succeeds Dr. Leland C. Grumbles, who served as department head for 20 years.

Dr. Hall first joined the College of Veterinary Medicine at Texas A&M in 1959 after academic experience at Michigan State University and the University of Arkansas.

Hall received a baccalaureate degree from Kansas State University in 1949 and a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree in 1951. He later received a Master of Science degree from Michigan State University in 1959.

University Press receives \$50,000

Mrs. Louise Lindsey Merrick of Tyler has given the Texas A&M University Press \$50,000 to establish a revolving fund for the publication of books on the Texas environment, announced Frank H. Wardlaw, director of the press.

The first book published in the series will be "A Treasury of Texas Wildlife" consisting of over 200 photographs in full color from the files of the Texas Parks and Wildlife magazine. The pictures will represent the principle species of birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians found in the state.

Woolfolk honored by resolutions
