Reduction of troopers won't hinder search

LOCUST GROVE, Okla. — The number of State Highway Patrol troopers searching for the slayer of three Girl Scouts was cut by 70 per cent yesterday, but a patrol spokesman denied the reduction was a sign the investigation was winding down.

Lt. Kenneth Van Hoy said the 35 troopers were needed for other duties, particularly during the July 4 weekend.

The troopers, local police, FBI agents and civilian volunteers are seeking Gene Leroy Hart, 33, a convicted rapist who has eluded lawmen for four years since break-ing out of the Mayes County Jail at brought into the area. Pryor


