Illegal fishermen stealing millions of dollars in fish

and other native Texas game fish are taken each year by outlaw commercial fishermen using illegal nets and traps, according to Texas Parks and Wildlife Department law enforcement officials

"Several hundred thousand pounds of fish are removed yearly from public streams and reservoirs by these outlaws," said Dexter Harris, P&WD law enforcement field operations director.

During one operation last spring at Lake Livingston, wardens work-ing around the clock for three weeks confiscated more than 36 miles of il-legally placed trotlines, 54 fish traps and 2,700 feet of illegal fish nets.

Wardens issued 204 citations during the crackdown, mostly for fishing without a license and for illegal trotlines.

Every time these fish bandits make a haul," said Harris, "they rob every fisherman in the state. These illegal fishermen work as often as they can, even during the winter months when they know wardens are busy with the hunting seasons Harris said wholesale removal of
