Speedway race may have 5 Indy champs

Five Indianapolis 500 former winners are expected to enter the American Parts 200 at Texas World Speedway on July 31. The former winners represent eleven victories at the famous brickyard.

Among those expected are two time winner Johnny Rutherford of Ft. Worth and fellow Texan A. J. Foyt of Houston, the only four time winner, Al and Bobby Unser of Albuquerque, New Mexico, each a two time winner and Gordon Johncock who is also defending national champion.

Several new cars are expected to run here for the first time including those of Al Unser, Gordon Johncock and Wally Dallenbach. Speeds are expected to be high and depending on the number of caution laps, there could be a new world record. The old record for two hundred miles was set here in October 1973 when Gary Bettenhausen averaged better than 181 miles per hour. Since then every race held here has averaged faster times but yellow caution flags have slowed the pace at the end.

The American Parts 200 offers Texans a chance to see the Indy 500 cars and drivers in their home state. The race is referred to as the "Indy of the Southwest."

Practice for the American Parts 200 begins on July 30 and will be followed by a live on stage concert in the speedway infield for overnight campers.

Time trials will begin at 11:00 a.m. July 31 with the 200 mile national championship event starting at 3:15 p.m.

Tickets for the American Parts 200 are still available.

Officials at Texas World Speedway in College Station and Jerry Doughtrey, the promoter at Navasota Speedway in Navasota jointly announced that a Texas Race of Champions qualifying race will be held this Saturday at Navasota Speedway.

The Texas Race of Champions (TROC) will be staged at Texas World Speedway on Saturday, October 15, 1977. The race will feature the best drivers of stock cars and road racing sedans from Texas area race tracks.

The winner of the Super Stock feature race at Navasota Speedway Saturday night will earn an automatic starting spot in the line-up for the Texas Race of Champions, a race that has become recognized as Texas' biggest and richest racing event for Texas drivers and TROC legal cars. This year's race will be 100 miles long on the two mile road racing circuit which employs 22 degree banked ovals and infield racing tracks.

The winner of the Super Stock feature race, also wins four tickets to the Indy car race at Texas World Speedway July 31.

Tickets scarce; Kyle expansion aided

General admission tickets for the Texas Tech and Michigan football games are no longer available at Texas A&M University. They are still being sold at Lubbock and Ann Arbor, however. Student tickets are also still available for those two games.

Only folding chair seats on the Kyle Field track remain for the Houston and Texas games. Plenty of stadium seats are available for the other home and away games.

Texas A&M's Sports Information Department hopes to have its football brochure on the stands by this Friday, SID assistant Jim Butler said.

The magazine, which capsules the Aggie prospectus and gives statistics on the team, sells for \$2.25.

Memories of one of baseball's greatest moments will be aroused by the Texas Ranger Old Timers game held this Saturday at Arlington Stadium.

The game will cast the New York Giant old timers against the former Brooklyn Dodgers in a recreation of the 1951 National League playoff between the two teams. With the three-game series tied at one win apiece, the Dodgers nursed a 4-1 going into the ninth inning. The Giants scored a run and with two men on base, Bobby Thomson put a Ralph Branca pitch into the stands to bring the National League pennant to New York.

Thomson and Branca will be matched once again in the two-inning contest at Arlington Stadium starting at 7:20 p.m.

The annual summer workshop for football officials is scheduled for July 22-23 at Texas A&M. The workshop is sponsored by the A&M Health and Physical Education Department.

Southwest Conference executive secretary Cliff Speegle and Hal Lahar, SWC assistant executive secretary and commissioner of officials, will lead the seminar.

Between 100 and 200 game officials usually attend the pre-season training, hoping to improve the professionalism of officiating at both the collegiate and public school levels.

Another West Coast bowl game is in the planning stages. A Seattle group hopes to provide a game between the all-stars of the Big Ten and Pac-10 conferences. The game has not yet been okayed by the NCAA Bowl Committee.

The Texas Amateur Athletic Federation Region V Women's Open Slow Pitch softball tournament will be held this weekend at Bee Creek Park.


The College Station Parks and Recreation Department sponsors the tournament which features teams from College Station, Waco, Temple, Killam, Huntsville and Brownwood. Tournament's winner will advance to the state tournament Grand Prairie on July 29-31.

University of Texas Head Football Coach Fred Akers has hired Charlie Lee as an assistant to work with wide receivers.

Lee, a graduate of Northern Arizona University, has been at Arizona University for the past three years. He fills the gap left by Jimmy Raye, who left to join the staff of the San Francisco 49ers after spring training.

Plans are being made for college football bowl games in San Diego, possibly with the Western Athletic Conference as host. This would shift the Fiesta Bowl from Tempe, Ariz. to the West Coast city. San Diego State has been named to the conference which is losing Arizona State and Arizona to the Pac-8 Conference. The Greater San Diego Sports Association set up a five-member steering committee with the goal of a bowl game starting in December of 1978.

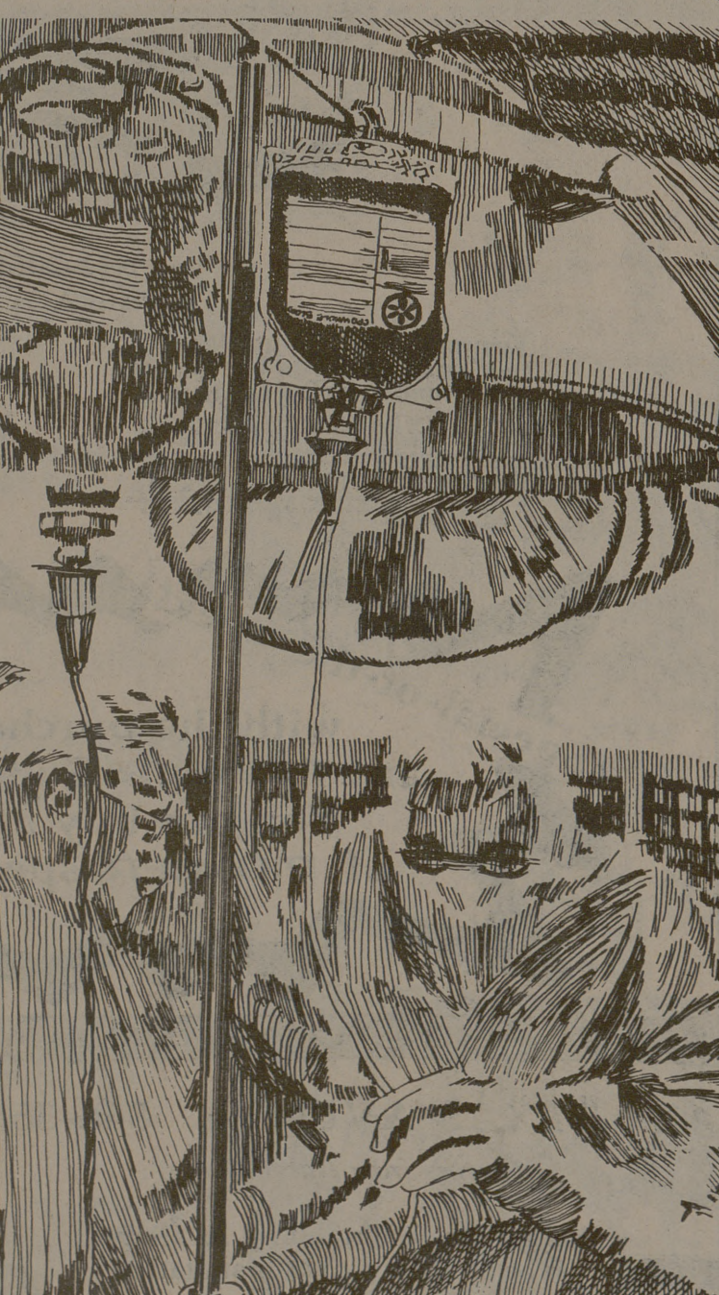
