Price, professor of veterinary physiology and pharmacology, will be in Washington July 25-27, then travel to San Juan, P.R. to serve as consultant to the University of San Juan in planning a baccalaureate degree program in veterinary medical technology.

Women engineers get national award

Two women aerospace engineering students from Texas A&M scooped up the only two sophomore scholarships for the entire nation awarded by the American Institute

of Aeronautics and Astronautics in 1977-78.

Theresa Jordan of Houston and Angelica Perez of Laredo won the \$1,000 scholarships over all the entrants in the U.S.

Both are aerospace engineering students and members of Texas A&M's engineering cooperative (work-study) education program. In the fall, the two women will spend the semester working for NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston.


